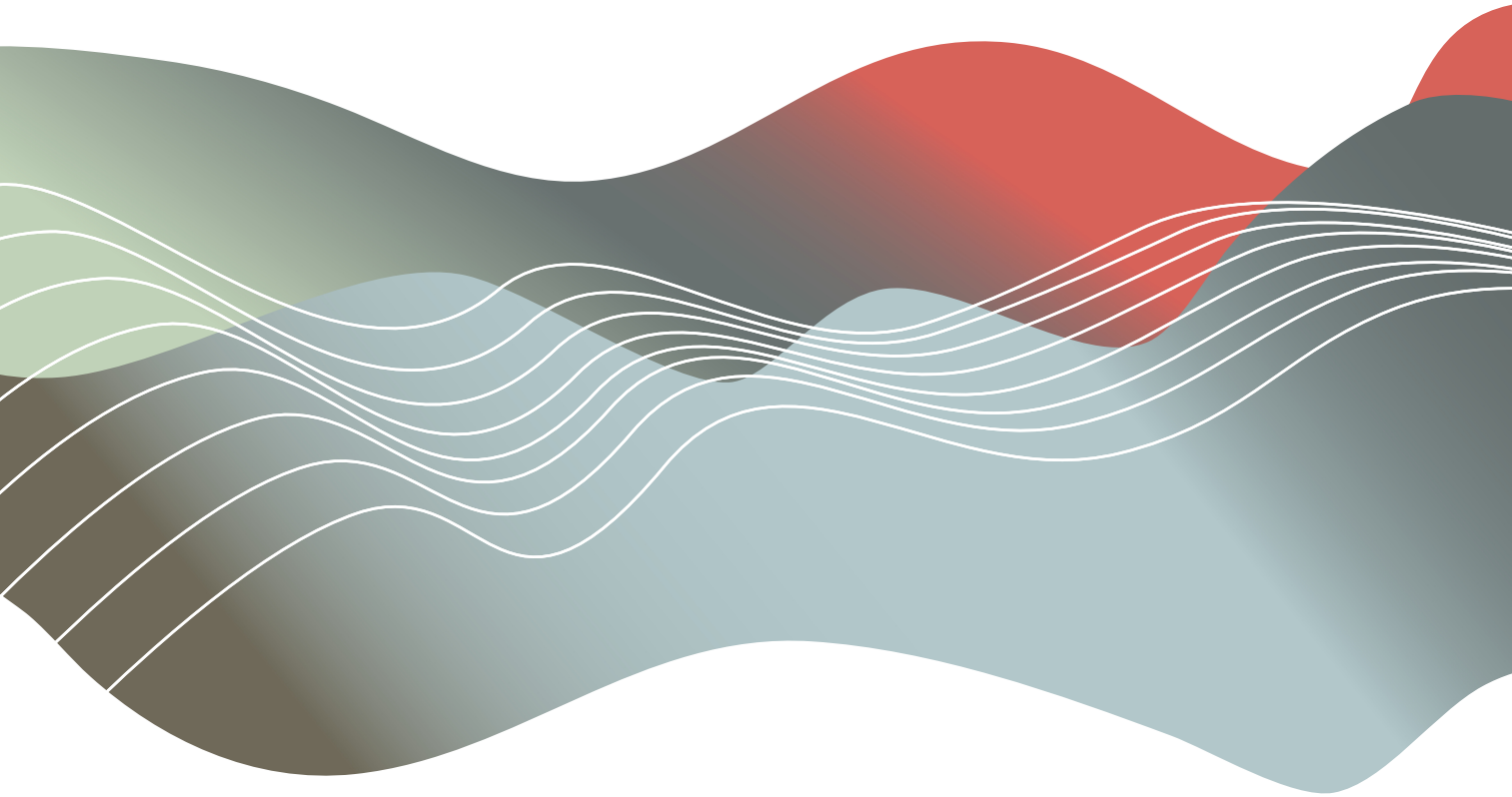

Foreword

Transilvania University of Braşov - the largest and best-performing university in Romania's Central Region - started the 2023-2024 academic year with 20,885 students (undergraduate, master's and doctoral degree studies) from all Romanian counties and from 87 other countries, but also 622 resident doctors and 44 students enrolled in the Romanian language preparatory year. The university's tenured teaching staff, researchers, and administrative personnel amounted to 1,352, along with 430 associated teaching staff.

The selection and stimulation of the performance of the human resource - students and teaching staff alike -, the most important resource of our university, was the priority of the UNITBV management in 2023 as well. The differentiated salary system for teaching staff and researchers, based on a set of performance indicators of both a didactic and scientific nature (which distinguishes our university in the Romanian academic landscape) was adjusted in 2023 to a higher percentage - from 20% to 30% - of holders who benefit from increased salary based on teaching quality indicators. The programmes to attract young performers continued (high-school valedictorians, graduates with a bacculaureate average 10, Olympians, etc.), as well as those to stimulate the participation of students in scientific, cultural, sports or professional events in the country and abroad. Significant resources have also been allocated to support students with social issues, both through national and university-funded programmes and projects. In 2023 there were over 600 students who benefited from free accommodation in the university dormitories and over 1,700 students who were granted social support.

In 2023, the digitization process of academic and administrative activities continued especially through the involvement of our students in several projects financed by the university, such as the programme "Be central!", the project "Digital transformation for innovation and competitiveness" (financed by PNRR), which emerged and amounted to over 34 million lei, the largest share of this amount being intended for investments in education and research infrastructure. At the same time, the programme aimed at the restoration/renovation of the didactic and social infrastructure of UNITBV continued, especially the buildings in the historic centre of Braşov and in the University's Colina campus, and the National Investment Company accelerated the pace of construction of the new dormitory next to the Library.

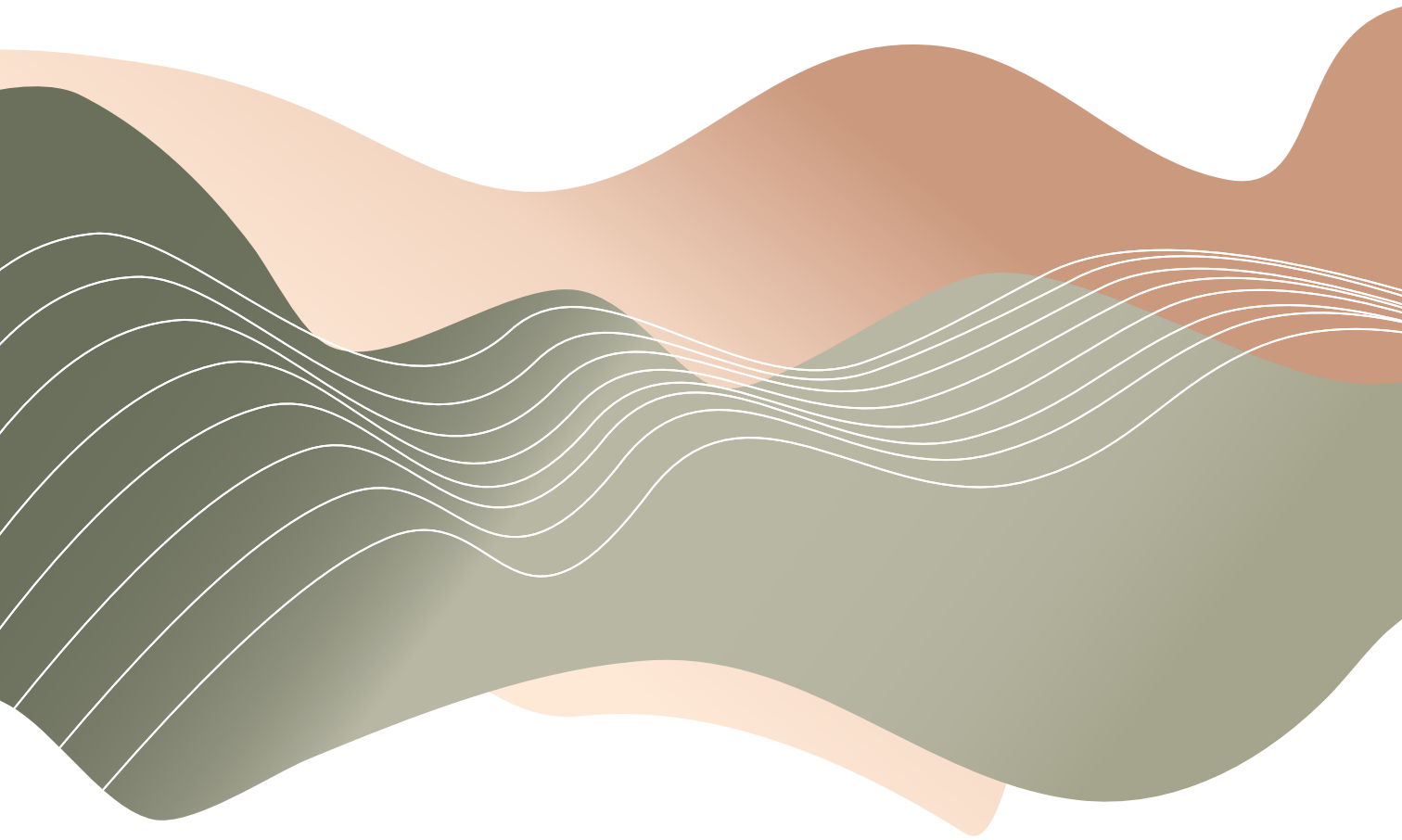
The study programmes have registered a high degree of stability, continuing the university's efforts to increase the offer of programmes in circulated languages and to develop new doctoral programmes. The number and quality of articles published in prestigious journals (indexed Web of Science) increased, and UNITBV continued its ascent in terms of national and international scientific visibility, maintaining its position in the national meta-ranking with only universities from Bucharest and Cluj-Napoca exceeding its performance. In 2023, the university was also actively involved in the cultural life by organizing numerous cultural events by the Music Centre, the Multicultural Centre, the Norbert Detaeye Media Library. Also, shows and exhibitions were organized by students and teachers abroad in collaboration with the Ministry of Foreign Affairs and the diplomatic representations of Romania.

As part of the internationalization process, the number of partner institutions reached 661, from 85 countries worldwide, and the number of full-time students increased to 521, from 87 countries. In 2023, the number of scholars financed by UNITBV increased significantly (including within the "Transilvania Academica Scholarship", scholarship programme for non-EU students), and this year priority was given to international students in the master's and doctoral degrees. The participation of Transilvania University of Braşov within the UNITA Alliance consisting of European Universities and the start of the project worth 14 million euros in November 2023, financed by the European Commission, represents a real catalyst for the integration process of our community of students and teaching staff in the European university area and for the quality enhancement of the university's teaching and research activity.

The annual revenues of the university were 333.1 million lei, and the expenses were 324.7 million lei, the university recording at the end of 2023 a cumulative budget surplus of over 204.4 million lei. The achievements of our community reflect the dedicated effort of all the teaching staff, supported by the employees in the administrative structures, but also the performance of our students and graduates, all of which leading to the development of the university and the increase of its prestige at a national and international level.

ACADEMIC ACTIVITY

UNITBV is the largest university in Romania's Centre Region. It is a mature university that has gained highly significant prestige over time at national and international level. Its stability and strength derive both from the wide diversity and from the unity of its integral elements. A comprehensive university, UNITBV offers bachelor's and master's degree programmes in over 40 fields (engineering, mathematics and computer science, biomedical sciences, social sciences, arts and humanities, as well as sports and physical education). The educational offer correlates with the professional requirements of the labour market, especially in terms of master's and continuing education programmes. The university structure includes programmes designed in collaboration with the companies that are traditional employers of UNITBV graduates, as well as niche programmes that anticipate the society's need for professional training in new areas of knowledge. This is why some programmes do not run every academic year as they are replaced by others which are of interest for the candidates. The sections dedicated to Bachelor's degree study programmes and Masters degree study programmes offer information about the bachelor's and master's programmes enrolling students in the academic year 2023-2024.

The teaching infrastructure is subject to continuous improvement as the university offers students' access to ergonomic spaces, state-of-the-art equipment and updated scientific information, as well as to an e-learning platform.

All the study programmes are accredited or authorized by the Romanian Agency for Quality Assurance in Higher Education, that evaluated the university in 2007, in 2013, in 2018 and in 2023 and granted the grade 'high degree of reliability'.

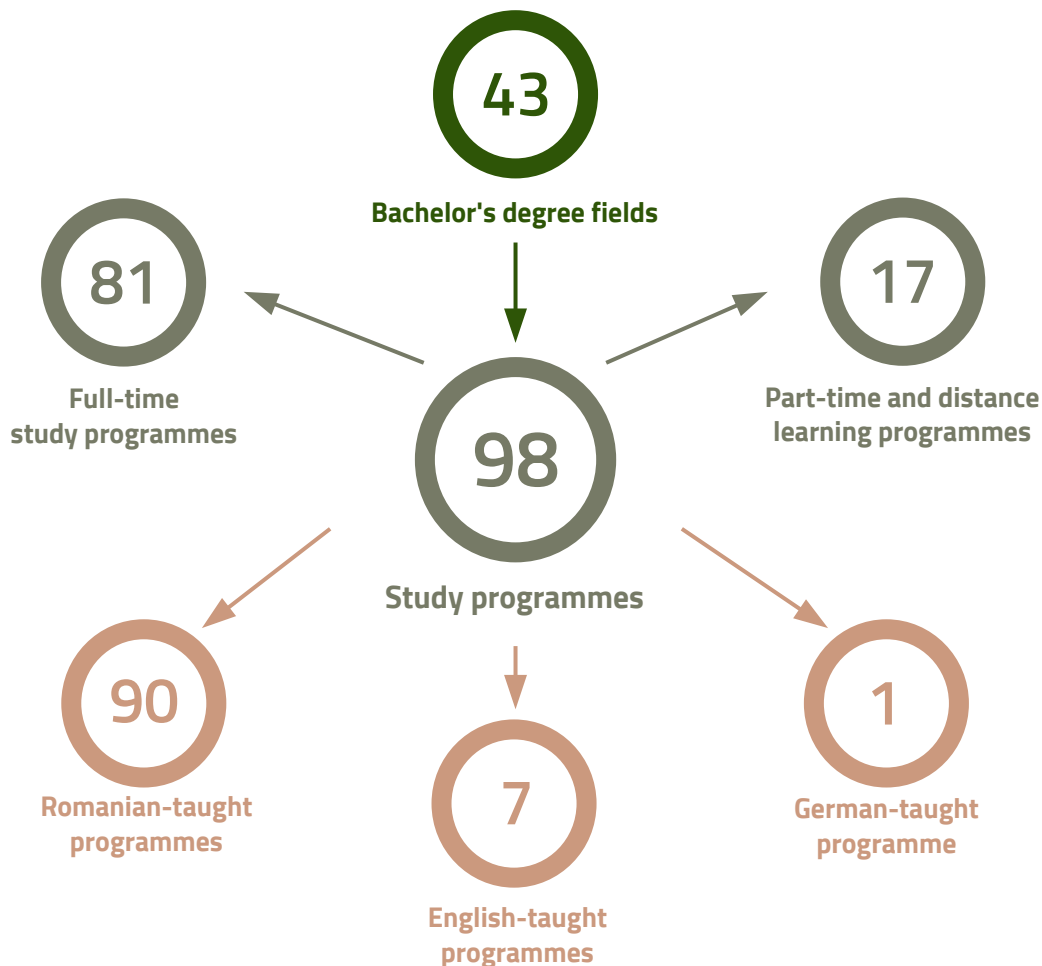

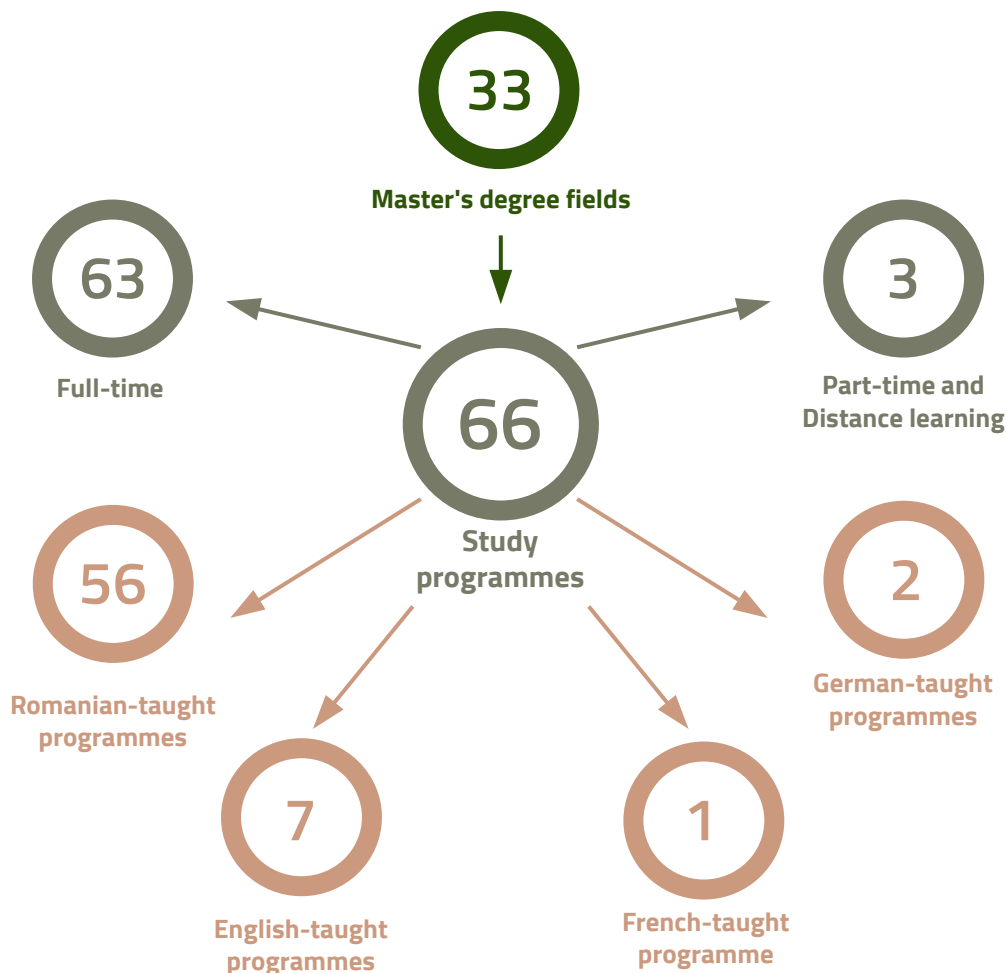

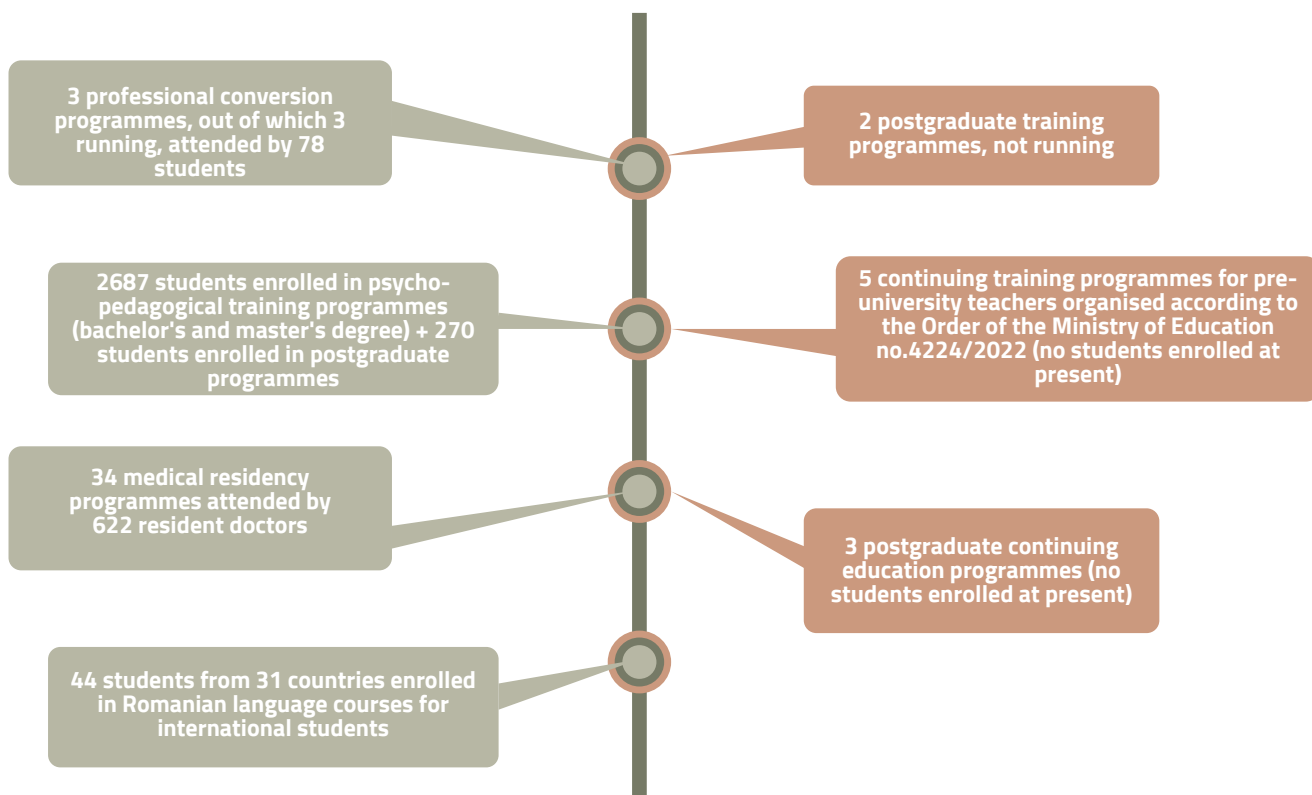
Doctoral study programmes

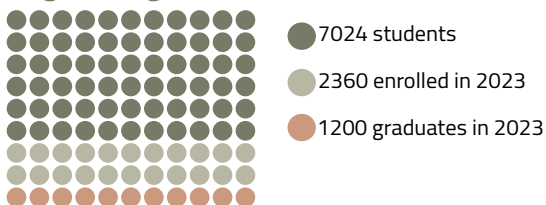

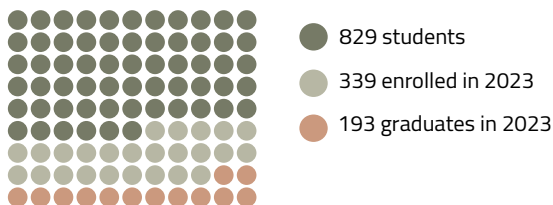

Number of enrolled students and graduates at bachelor's degree, by fields

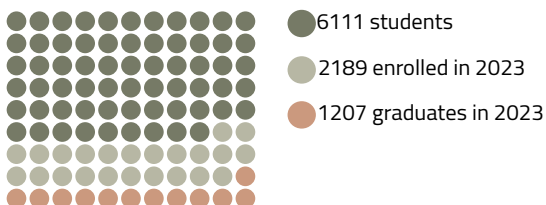

Enrolment and graduation by fields at bachelor's degree level

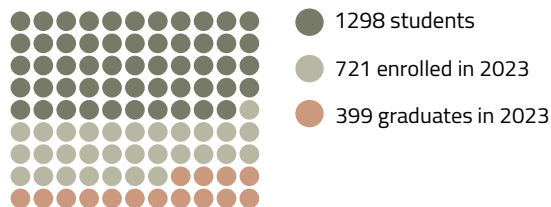

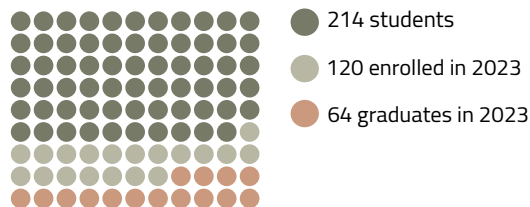

Number of enrolled students and graduates at masters's degree, by fields

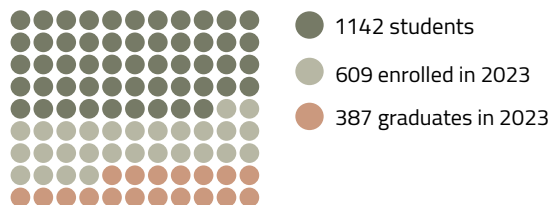

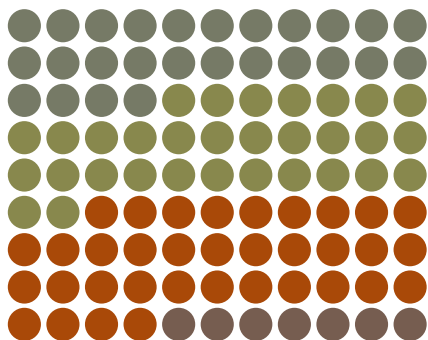

The positions of Assistant Lecturer are occupied mainly for a fixed period of time by doctoral students and fresh PhD graduates aspiring for a university career.

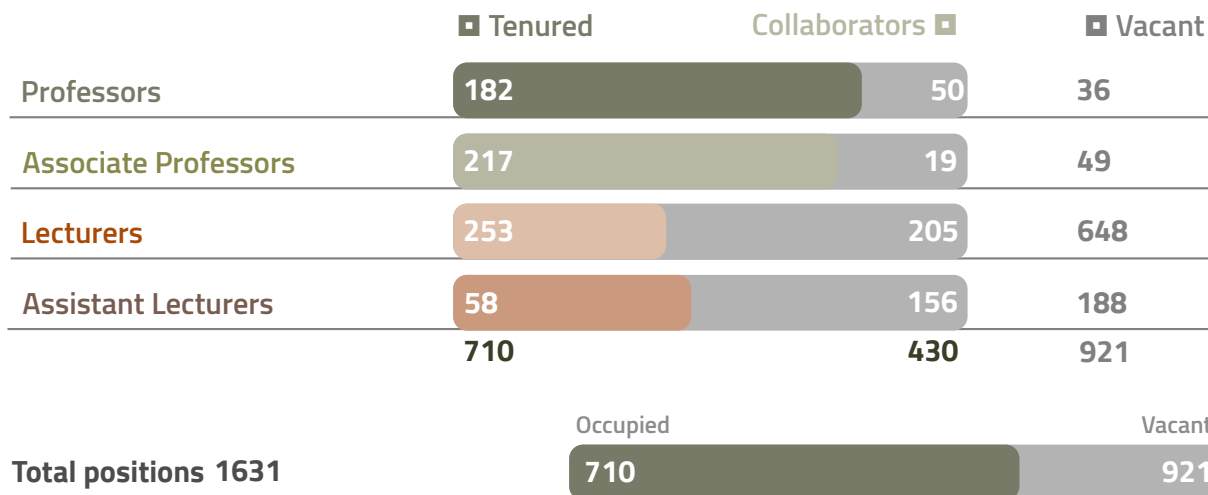
Tenured Academic Staff

Academic teaching positions and occupation of vacancies



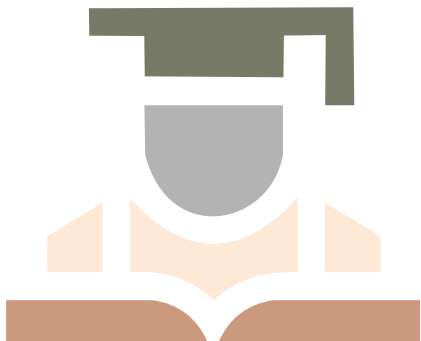

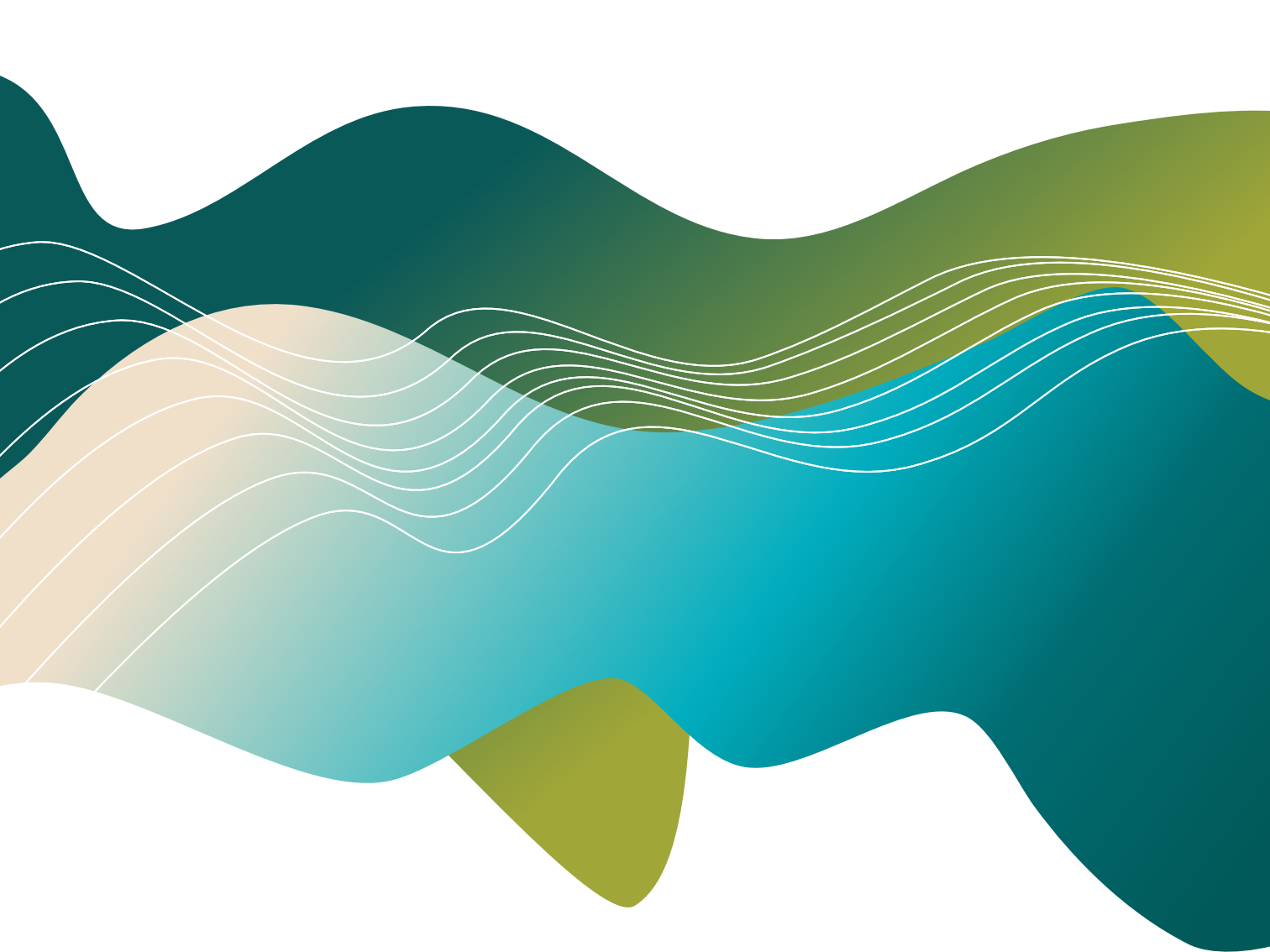


The recognition of the qualities of the academic teaching personnel through a consistent financial reward (increase of the monthly salary by 1500 RON for one year) is a means by which UNITBV annually stimulates the performance of its academic staff in terms of their activity with students.

UNITBV is the only Romanian university to have implemented the programme 'The most appreciated professor by the class' since the academic year 2017-2018. The mechanism by which this programme is applied involves each graduate's secret 'vote' (cast before the final exam) for the most appreciated professor.

The salary increase is granted to: (a) the members of the academic staff who received the highest number of 'votes' from the bachelor's degree graduates, and (b) the members of the academic staff who totalled the highest percentage of 'votes' from the bachelor's and master's degree graduates (15% of the total number of tenured academic personnel in each case).

In 2023, based on the votes of the year's graduates, 216 academic staff members (47 professors, 80 associate professors, 75 lecturers and 14 assistant lecturers) received the salary increase based on their performance as evaluated by the graduates.



RESEARCH

Interdisciplinary research reflects the university's comprehensive structure, integrating engineering, social sciences, humanities, arts, medicine, mathematics, sports, and physical education. It also serves as a strategic cornerstone for the institution's regional and international recognition. In 2023, the outcomes from 710 teaching staff and 57 researchers reflect a consistent trend towards enhanced performance. This is evidenced by the increased publication rate in esteemed journals and the elevated quality of results, including heightened visibility and the broadening scope of research projects, establishment of international partnerships, and diversification of dissemination methods. Furthermore, the university's notable standings in both international and national rankings underscore the success of its research endeavours.

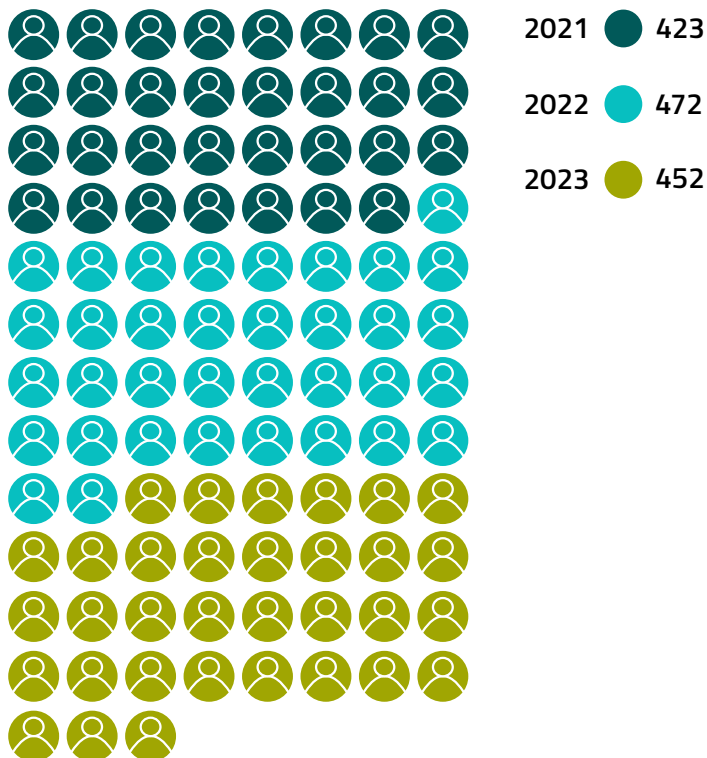

Publications and patents

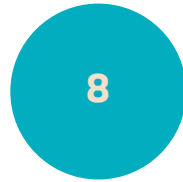


Indexed ISI WoS / Clarivate Analytics publications*

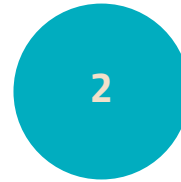

HR EXCELLENCE IN RESEARCH

In 2023, the European Commission granted the "HR Excellence in Research Award" to the university, acknowledging the institution's dedicated efforts and significant strides in implementing the provisions outlined in the European Charter for Researchers and the 40 principles of the Code of Conduct for the Recruitment of Researchers. This certification not only signifies institutional commitment but also underscores the university's pledge to adhere to the "HR Strategy for Researchers - HRS4R," an iterative approach focused on enhancing mechanisms for research career development.



**STUDENTS AND THE RELATION WITH THE
ECONOMIC ENVIRONMENT**

Throughout the year 2023, Transilvania University (UNITBV) continued to allocate resources for the development/modernization processes of the university campus, aiming to ensure optimal study and living conditions for students. As such, repair and rehabilitation/modernization works were carried out on a series of teaching and common spaces. Similar works were also performed in the university dormitories, both inside and in adjacent exterior areas (alleys, parks, household waste collection areas, etc.).

The academic performance of students was supported through the provision of specific scholarships (for academic performance), while international mobility (for study and practice) was supported through mobility scholarships; students with social issues benefited from social scholarships and other support options (free accommodation and/or meals, tuition fee reductions/exemptions, etc.).

A series of events and projects for students, which have become traditional at UNITBV, were organized/carried out, such as the Gala of Valedictorians, Graduates in Front of Companies – AFCO, the Student Scientific Circles Session, the Colina League Cup, the Transilvania Summer Event – TSE, and the Green – Life Hackathon.

High school graduates who chose to study at UNITBV as valedictorians of their high school and bachelor's degree graduates who were valedictorians at their faculties and chose to continue their studies in UNITBV's master's programmes benefited from free laptops, accommodation, and meals.

Internal project competitions intended for students, such as 'Be Central!', 'My Diploma Project', continued in 2023, with UNITBV allocating over 2,100,000 lei for this purpose.

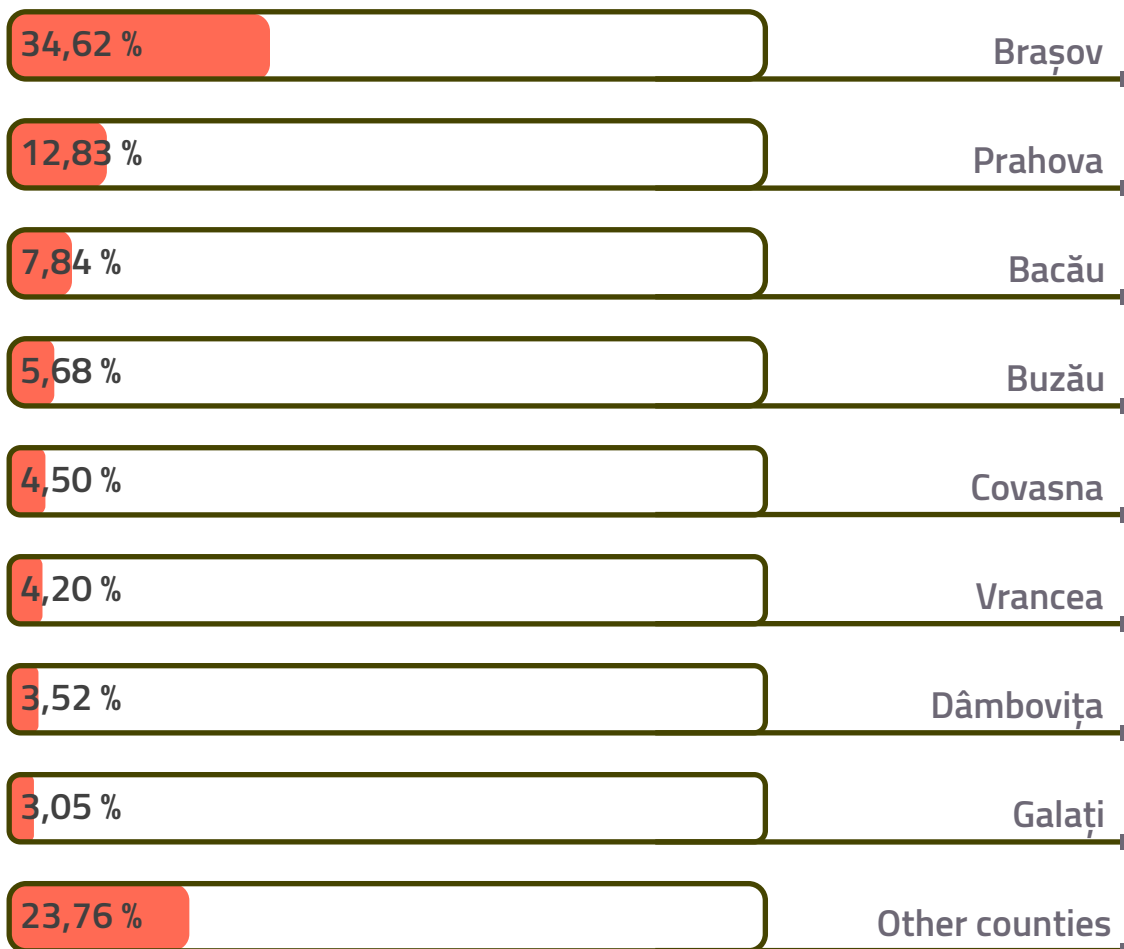

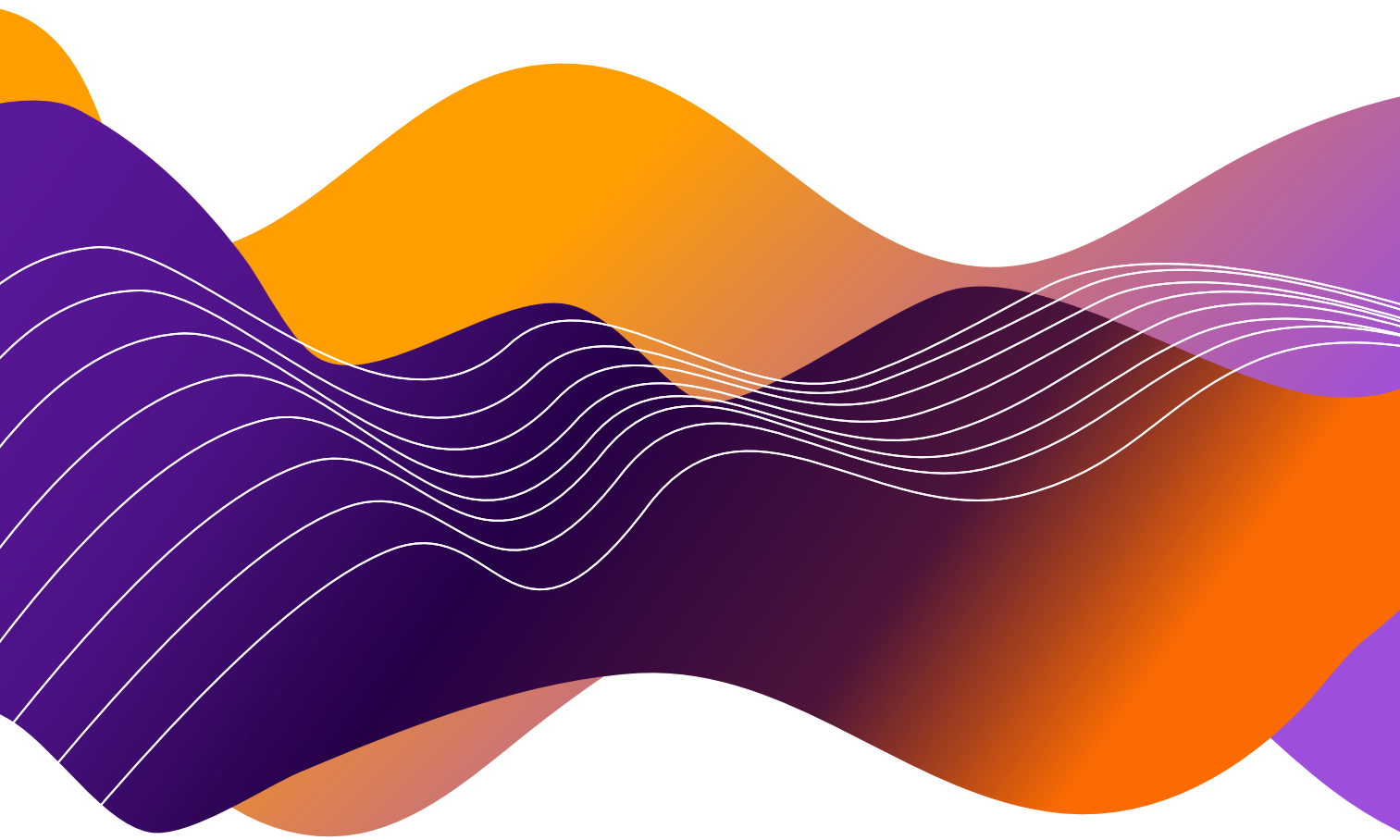

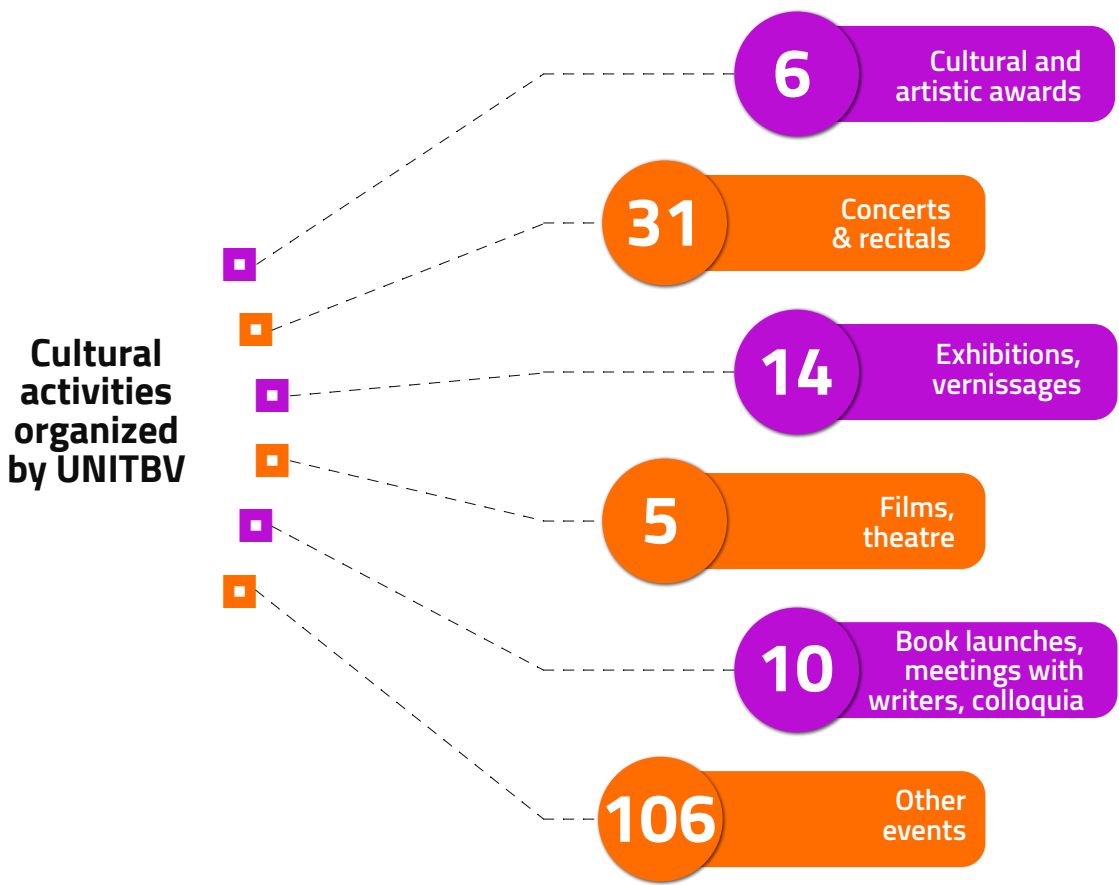

INTERNATIONALIZATION

The intensification of the internationalization process represents a strategic priority for UNITBV. The achievement of this overall objective, integrated in the general development strategy, will contribute to the adaptation of the university to the current international context of Higher Education and a constantly changing environment.

It will implicitly lead to increasing the visibility and quality of the education and scientific research processes due to expanding cooperation with relevant institutions from the countries of the European Union and from outside the European space. In order to achieve this aim, UNITBV has set several specific objectives:

(i) to develop the institutional capacity and to increase the university's international visibility by international counseling;

(ii) to increase the university's potential to attract international students by developing, at the level of each faculty, at least one programme taught in foreign languages (including partnerships with other universities in the country or abroad), especially for the master's and doctoral study programmes;

(iii) to stimulate the participation of the academic staff in international educational, scientific events, as a premise for developing international cooperation, for improving the visibility of the university and for increasing the quality;

(iv) to intensify the involvement of specialists from abroad in the university's teaching, research and administrative processes;

(v) to increase the university's visibility and the number of international students by funding several scholarship / support programmes for the students from less developed countries;

(vi) to intensify the collaboration with the Ministry of Foreign Affairs, with Romania's diplomatic missions abroad and with other institutions / organizations from the country and abroad, with a view to developing joint projects in the field of education or research / technical assistance, or for promoting the Romanian language, culture and civilization, as well as for attracting international students.

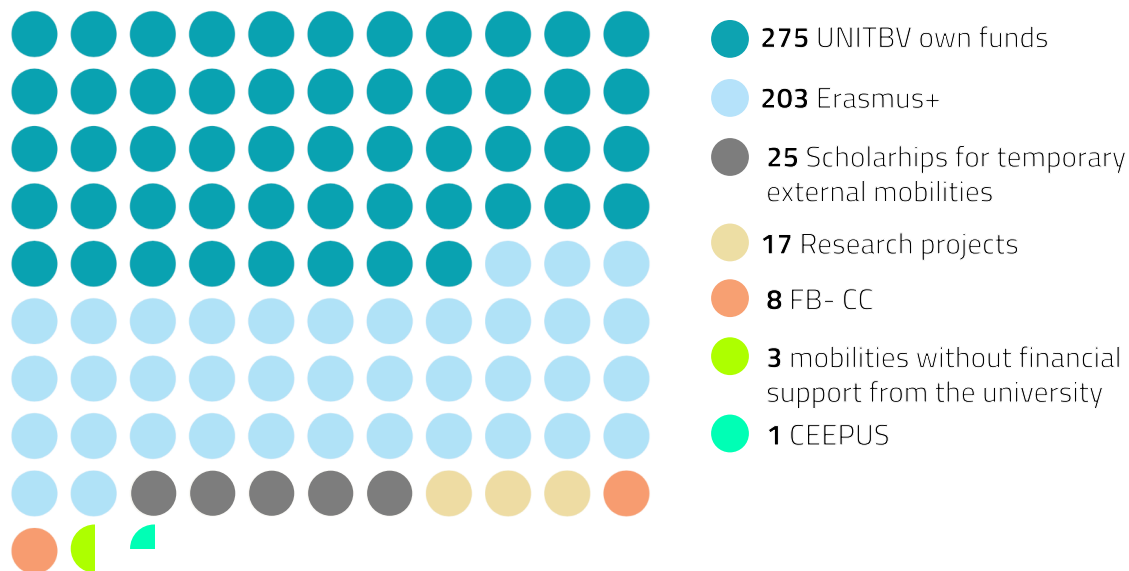

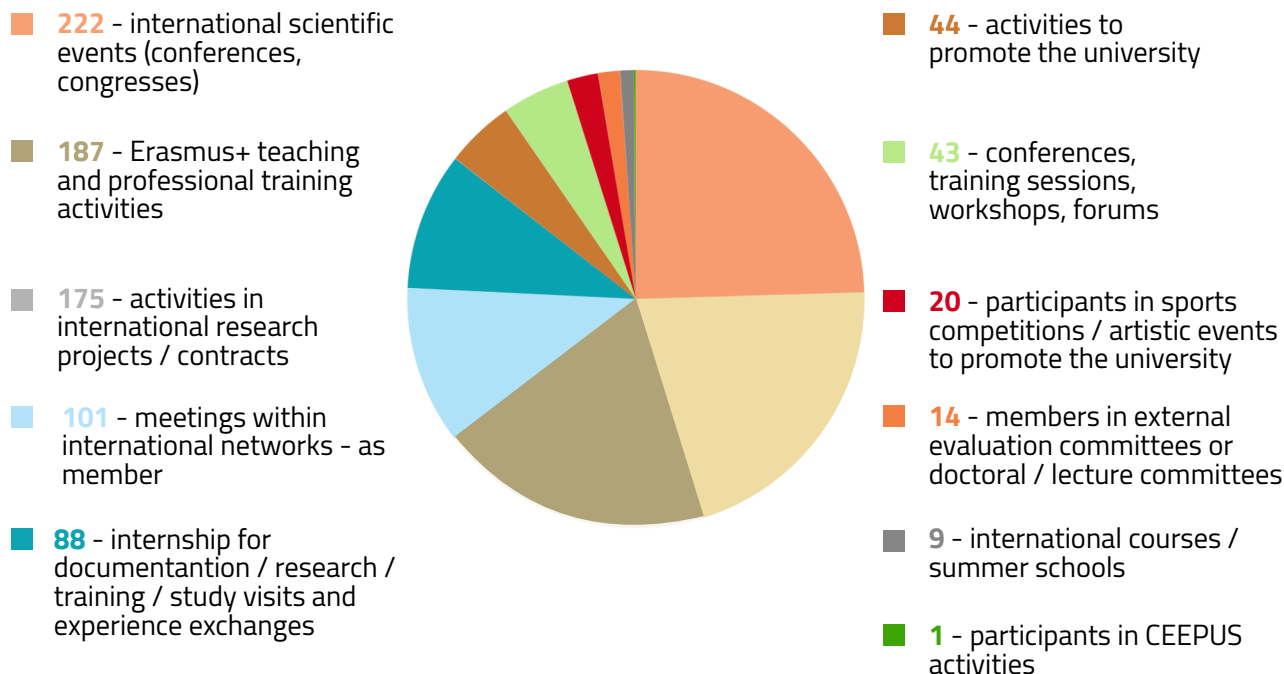

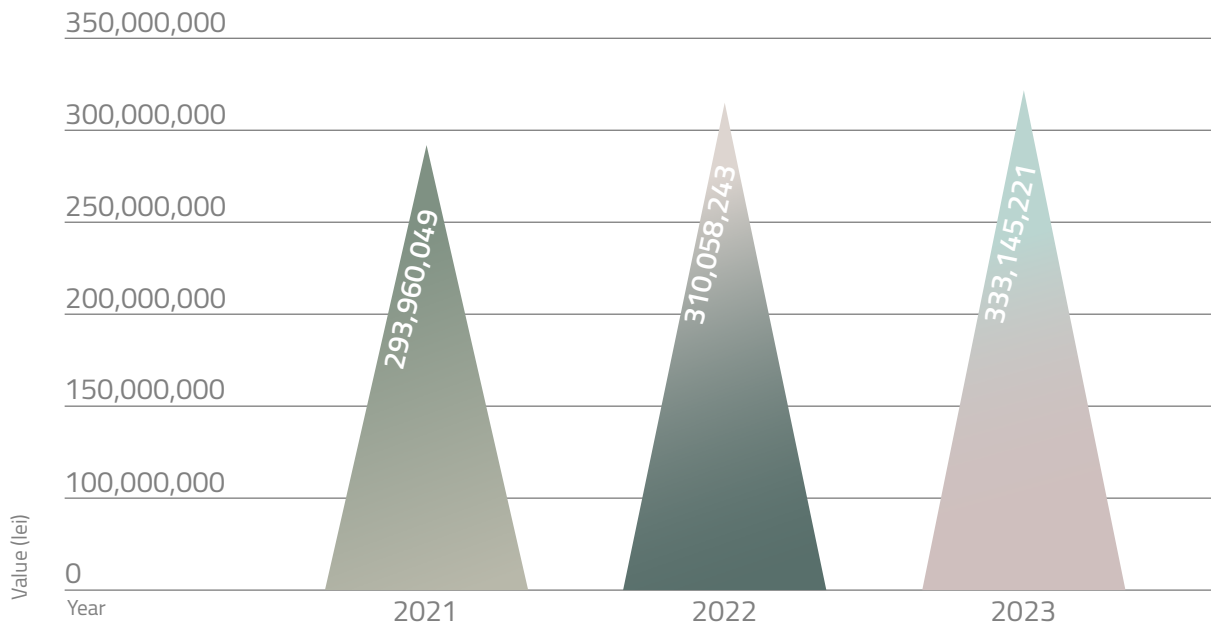

Revenues

The total revenue collected in 2023 from subsidies to public institutions and own revenue amounted to **333,145,221 RON**, marking an increase of **7.45%** compared to 2022 and **13.33%** compared to 2021.

Revenues in RON collected in 2023 by sources

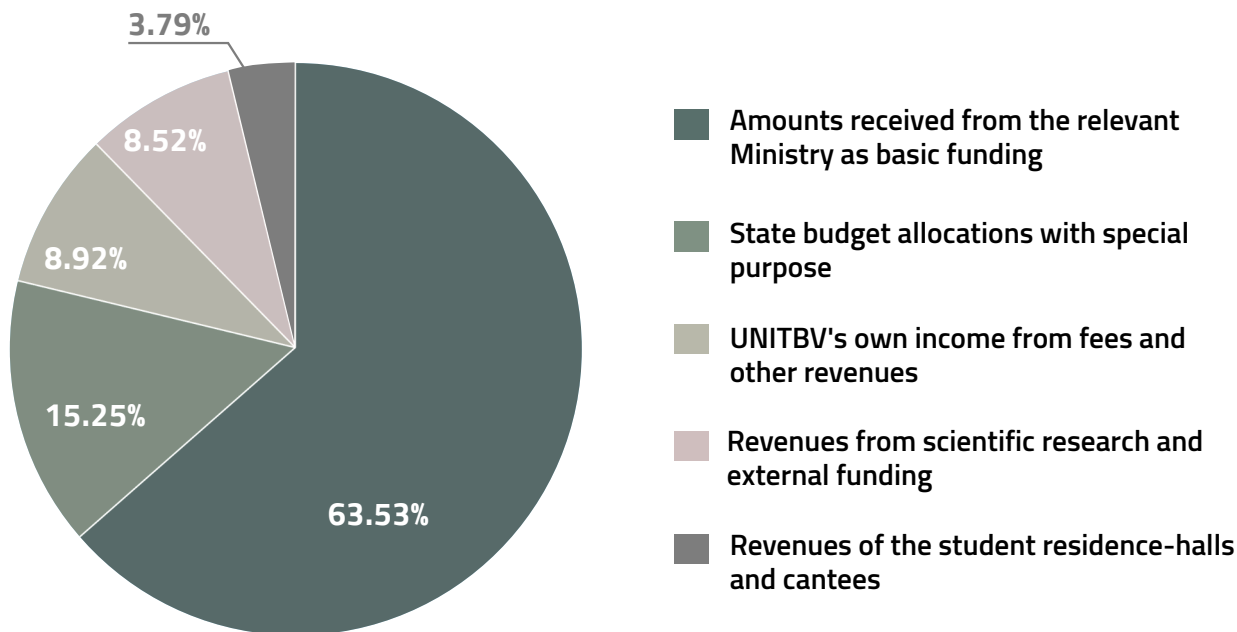

In 2023, the university's degree of self-financing, derived from tuition fees, administrative fees, donations and sponsorships, rents, scientific research, student residence-halls and canteens, and from non-reimbursable financing amounted to **21.23%**. The remaining **78.77%** was covered by funding from the Ministry of Education as basic financing, and through allocations from the state budget with a special purpose.

Expenditure

Transilvania University of Braşov made total payments of 324,734,974 RON, by 8,410,247 RON less than the revenues actually collected.

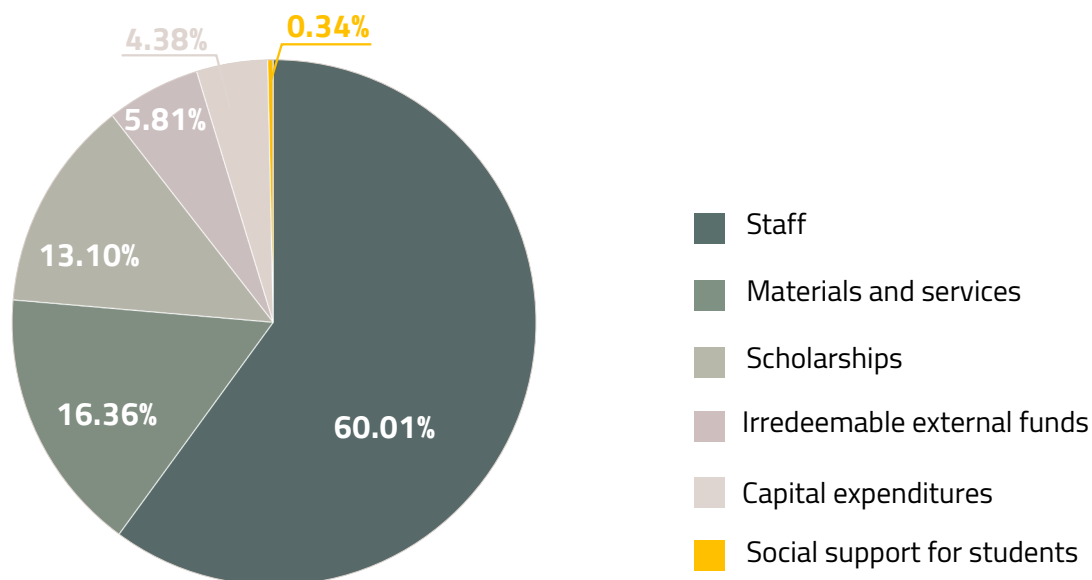

The growth rate of total expenditure in 2023 was lower than that of total revenue collected, thereby positively impacting the budgetary outcome by increasing it.

In the current period, compared to the previous year, expenditure on salaries, materials, and services constituted a smaller proportion of total expenditure, whereas spending on scholarships and social assistance for students—such as transportation and other travel expenses, and material expenses—increased. This rise was attributed to changes in scholarship amounts outlined in Higher Education Law No. 199/2023 and other regulations. Additionally, investments saw an increase in 2023 relative to 2022, primarily due to building refurbishments, with a nearly equivalent allocation for current repairs.

Result of the budget execution

In accordance with Article 59(1) of the Public Finance Law No. 500/2002, the budget outcome is determined by the difference between revenues and spending. In this context, as of December 31, 2023, Transilvania University of Brasov registered a budget surplus, reflected in the cash available in accounts held with the Brasov Treasury and commercial banks, as follows:

■ available in Braşov Treasury = 177,340,623 RON, of which:

- surplus related to budget execution = 176,041,487 RON
- Norwegian EAA mechanism surplus = 11,293 RON
- available in special accounts = 1,287,843 RON

■ available in commercial banks = 27,131,472 RON, of which:

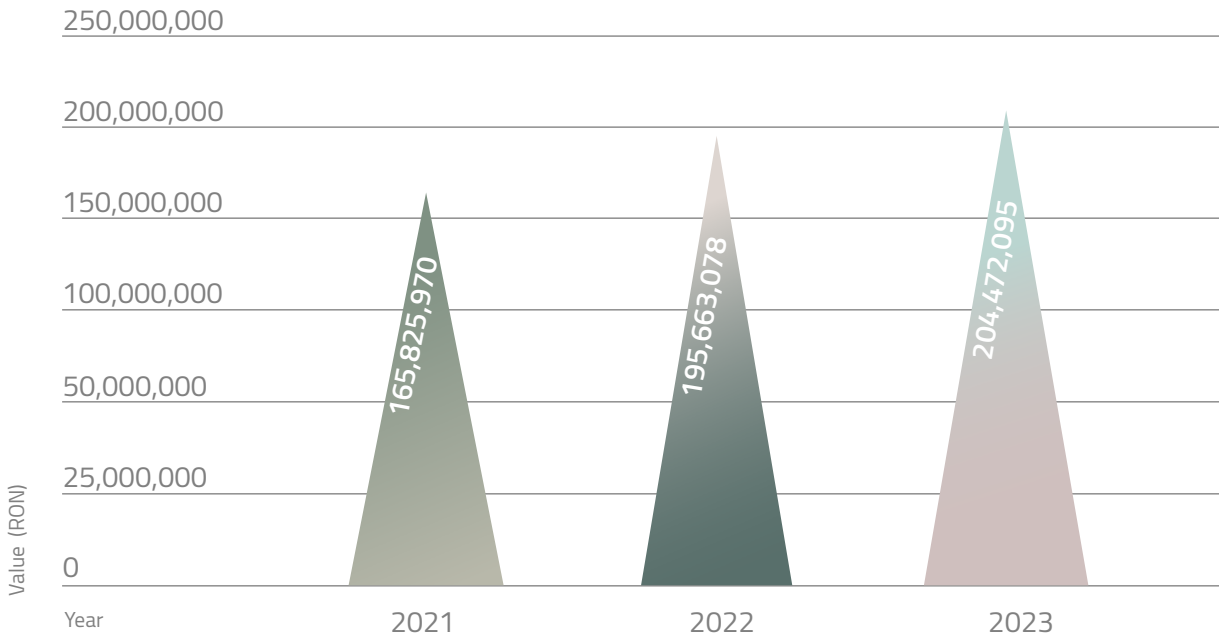
- available in the foreign currency account = 9,565,941 RON
- available from international projects = 17,483,715 RON
- available in special accounts = 81,816 RON

The cash held in special accounts comprises performance bonds, tender guarantees, management guarantees, bank letters of guarantee, salary deposits, scholarship deposits, and sponsorships from previous years.

The registered surplus is relatively constant and is generated in proportion to 86.73% of the basic activity carried out through the State Treasury accounts, and 13.27% of the activity carried out through commercial banks.
