

# TRANSILVANIA UNIVERSITY OF BRASOV - FOR THE FIRST TIME IN THE PRESTIGIOUS SHANGHAI INTERNATIONAL RANKING

On 29 June 2020, the results of the international *Shanghai* ranking *(Global Ranking of Academic Subjects – GRAS)* by fields were made public; it is worthy of note that Transilvania University of Brasov reached a new performance, entering this prestigious ranking for the first time.



Shanghai ranking by fields includes the best-performing 500 universities in the world for each of the 54 analysed fields. In the field of Natural Sciences/Physics, Transilvania University of Brasov ranks 401-500, along with two other Romanian universities ("Babeş-Bolyai" University of Cluj and "Polytechnics" University of Bucharest). This year, only nine Romanian universities are included in Shanghai rankings by fields, which take into account the publications of the most prestigious scientific journals in the world.



The Rector of Transilvania University of Brasov, Prof. Dr. Eng. Ioan Vasile Abrudan, has declared: "It is an outstanding performance, along with the recent inclusion of our university in other prestigious international rankings. Although I believe that there are still many activities and

processes in the university that need to be improved and developed, these results show us that our efforts are beginning to pay off".



GRAS 2020 is an internationally renowned ranking developed by Shanghai Ranking Consultancy company. Shanghai Ranking has been publishing the *Academic Ranking of World Universities* (ARWU) by academic fields since 2009. This year's version contains rankings of universities in Natural Sciences, Engineering, Life Sciences, Medical Sciences and Social Sciences. Overall, more than 4000 universities were classified in these fields.

# UNITBV – THE HIGHEST RISE OF A ROMANIAN UNIVERSITY IN THE INTERNATIONAL RANKING OF THE CENTER FOR WORLD UNIVERSITY RANKINGS

Transilvania University of Brasov reached a new performance. In the international ranking published on 8 June 2020 by the *Centre for World University Rankings* (CWUR), the University of Brasov was presented as the fastest-growing Romanian university. Having entered CWUR raking on the 1.844<sup>th</sup> place, along with 12 other university of our country, this year, Transilvania University of Brasov climbed 144 places, being in the top 8.5% of the universities all over the world, while six other Romanian universities went down in the ranking, and two were eliminated.



CWUR ranking takes into account over 20.000 universities worldwide and analyses the quality of the educational process, the results of the research activity, the quality and number of scientific publications, but also the graduates' degree of insertion on the labour market, without taking into account the opinion polls or the data transmitted by the academic institutions.

The Rector of Transilvania University of Brasov, Prof. Dr. Eng. Ioan Vasile Abrudan, stated regarding this result: "The recent inclusion of Transilvania University of Brasov in several international rankings is a recognition of the progress attained in the educational and scientific activity. I am sure that through the efforts we make for internationalization, but especially through the investment in human resources, our university will significantly increase its national and international visibility in the following years".

With regard to the methodology used to generate this ranking, CWUR uses seven objective indicators:

- 1) The quality of education, measured by the number of university graduates who obtained major academic distinctions in relation to the size of the university (25%);
- 2) The graduates' degree of insertion on the labour market, measured by the number of university graduates who held top positions in the largest companies in the world in relation to the size of the university (25%);
- 3) The quality of the faculties, measured according to the number of members who obtained major academic distinctions (10%);
- 4) Research performance, with the sub-indicators: 4.1. Research results, measured by the total number of scientific articles (10%); 4.2. High quality publications, measured by the number of scientific articles appeared in top-level journals (10%); 4.3. Influence, measured by the number of scientific articles appearing in highly influential journals (10%); 4.4. Citations, measured by the number of scientific articles with a high degree of reference (10%).

Recently, Transilvania University of Brasov ranked third in the top of Romanian universities in the international ranking *Times Higher Education — Impact Rankings* (which included only seven universities in our country). UNITBV also reached the performance of being the Romanian university with the most significant increase in the latest edition of the prestigious international QS ranking of universities in Emerging Europe and Central Asia.

### EXHIBITION "FROM ROME TO COMPOSTELA. ARCHITECTURE AND SACRED SPACE"

The exhibition "From Rome to Compostela. Architecture and Sacred Space", which was hosted by the whole museum *Casa Mureşenilor* of Brasov between 1 June and 1 October 2020, dedicated to the Christian Catholic universe, is part of a cultural project of the architect Teofil Mihăilescu, a project dedicated to exploring the universe of architecture and sacred space from an anthropological perspective, in the context of his travelling through the symbolic paths of the great religions of humanity.



The photographs of the exhibition were taken in Rome (2017) and along the European itineraries *El Camino Francés* (2018, 1.000 km from St. Jean le Pied du Port la Santiago de Compostela) and *El Camino Portugués* (2019, 700 km from Lisbon to Santiago de Compostella), cycled through by Teofil Mihăilescu.



The exhibition presents over 300 photographs and 14 paintings in mixed technique, all signed by Teofil Mihăilescu, and the original diplomas and medals attesting to going through the Caminos, as well as a New Age installation, in an avant-garde concept and

montage, for the first time in Brasov, with a strong symbolism: over 60 m of sticker glued to the floor symbolically marks the Pilgrim's and Visitor's *Camino* through suites of earth textures, 30 pallets cite in synthetic the organic elements of nature, four video projectors present in images with areas of over 10 sqm hundreds of *selfies* of the author, taken along the way and accompanying the architectural photos of the exhibition, and two multimedia installations present atmospheric images and videos, including the video with the cover for the song *La sera dei miracoli* composed by Lucio Dalla and performed by Teofil Mihailescu in the very premises of the museum, temporarily transformed into a studio, a song dedicated to this exhibition.



More than just documentary trips and/or mental and physical challenges, the rediscovery of Rome, but especially travelling through the Caminos, and the quiet exploration of Portugal and Spain were initiatory experiences. The omnipresence of antiquity through real worlds of spectacular historical sites, the spectacle of the parade of the great Romanesque basilicas or Gothic cathedrals lined up the Road like the beads of a symbolic rosary, anonymous solitudes in great architectural structures, the living experience of the fusion in architecture of Islam with Christianity, the direct contact with many of the landmarks of the history of architecture had the power to "build" avalanches of emotions, thoughts, turmoil. monologues - delicious dialogues and often contradictory states. The photos of the exhibition were selected from a portfolio of several thousand photos, inviting to meditation and dialogue in the great values of humanity: love, tolerance, truth.



From Mihai Bonca (founder of *Brand Architects* and former Senior Brand Manager for the brands *Timișoreana, Ursus* and *Ciucaș* and former marketing director of *MolsonCoors Romania* and former marketing director of *eMag*), the CRP 3 students learned about generating *Big Idea* in advertising, and

2<sup>nd</sup>-year students in Digital Media, learned about brand associations and personalities. In two different courses, the CRP 1 and CRP 2 students had the opportunity to listen and ask questions to Tudor Fulea, *Client Service Director Europe* at *Leo Burnett Group UK*).



#### E-INTERNATIONALIZATION IN TIMES OF A PANDEMIC

Much can be written about the shortcomings of this strange period we are going through, but I set out to write now about the opportunities I have taken advantage of, from the perspective of internationalization and, more precisely, about the development of international relations for Romania - Brazil relationship.




In late 2017, a cooperation agreement was signed with Grupo Educacional UNIS, a private educational group headquartered in Varginha, State of Minas Gerais. Under this agreement, there were three incoming mobilities for the teaching staff, an outgoing mobility and two incoming mobilities for the purpose of study, as well as a teaching outgoing mobility, which I benefited from in February this year. On this occasion, I better understood the desire and efforts of the Brazilians in general and of the UNIS partners, in particular, to develop strong international partnerships.



Although academic activities in Brazil went online almost simultaneously with those in Romania, UNIS partners submitted the first proposal for online cooperation in early April 2020. Thus, on 22 April, I was the guest of UNIS and U.EXPERIENCE (the network of 28 private universities initiated by UNIS) for a webinar on brand communication during the pandemic. Another colleague from the department, Lecturer Dr. Ada Dobrescu, held a webinar in June. Soon came the proposal to participate in the sixth edition of the conference organized by UNIS, organized online between 29.06–1.07.2020.

In figures, the UNIS online congress meant 3.735 participants (of which 2.800 students), 238 papers, 77 participants from 61 universities in Brazil, 32 participants from 19 foreign universities and 81 networking meetings. Of the 32 international speakers, four were from UNITBV: Prof. Dr. Angela Repanovici (Faculty of Product Design and Environmental), Assoc. Prof. Dr. Roxana Matefi (Faculty of Law), Lecturer Dr. Ana Maria Bolborici and the undersigned (Faculty of Sociology and Communication).



A particularly productive activity on the conference agenda was the online networking meetings with representatives of the universities from the U.EXPERIENCE consortium. In the seven meetings with representatives of seven different universities scattered almost all over Brazil, we identified various areas of cooperation. The first projects will be developed online; and, depending on their success, the enhancement of the bilateral cooperation with the interested universities might be decided.

Other events, such as the inauguration of the concert organ of Transilvania University of Brasov, or the concert that marked the inauguration of Neupert "Blanchet" harpsichord (2015), the debut of the Chamber Orchestra of Transilvania University, the inauguration of the second concert piano through a two-piano recital, as well as recitals, symphonic or jazz concerts, presented during the seasons of the Music Centre over the years, could be watched and listened to once more.

Upon returning from this internship, the two students want to share with other colleagues and potential students of the faculty the experiences, and to make recommendations on the importance of participating in such an international program on both personal and professional development level of any student:

"Here we are in the Czech Republic, the country where many of my colleagues chose to study through the Erasmus + programme. Once here, we can say that you learn to manage on your own, which, believe us, will take you out of your comfort zone. So, if you like challenges, Erasmus is one of the options. I'm sure you're familiar with the hardships of the first road trip - that's why we applied a second time. I don't want to leave you under the impression that things are simple, but they are not complicated either, it's just up to you how you react to the environment in which you are. Challenges arose for us as well, starting from English to the adaptation to the new environment, but after the first three weeks we felt that we had always belonged to the place. And don't forget one thing, you always have friends you can count on!", explained Beni Vesa.



"Why Erasmus? I will start from the premise that any of you reading these lines, but not only, are looking for both personal and professional development. The story goes how important volunteering, Erasmus mobility, etc. are during college. So I decided to go on this path of development, starting with volunteering, then continuing with the Erasmus mobility and I will certainly discover other opportunities within the Faculty of Silviculture and Forestry Engineering. I think life is an adventure; all you should do is having the courage to venture. My Erasmus experience starts in the city of Brno, Czech Republic, with some new, but very friendly people, at the same time, which applies to both students and teachers. I think every student should take part at least once in the programme because, in addition to the opportunity to interact with other people, other cultures, other structures and contents of education, you get to know yourself, to form a clearer picture of future plans and, of course, new perspectives. And now, after everything I experienced here, I would guide as many students as possible to live the Erasmus «adventure» from which, for sure, they will only have to learn. For me, this is what Erasmus meant ", added Ionuț Pogan.

#### SUCCESSFUL ALUMNI - DR. ENG. MARIUS CORNEL GIURGIU



I came into contact with wood industry in 1993, when I began to attend the Forest School Group of Cluj-Napoca, without knowing much about this field and without having any reference or family member in this profession. As a child, not knowing which direction to turn off to, I started with the three-year vocational school. I clung to the guidance of a dear teacher, then I attended high school at the same institution, with a view to moving forward on this line.

In 1998 I entered the Faculty of Wood Industrialization (currently the Faculty of Wood Engineering), in the life of which I tried to get involved as much as possible. I participated in various activities, scientific communication sessions and the like, in order to accumulate as much knowledge as possible, thinking about what would follow.

In 2003 I benefited from an Erasmus scholarship at Universidad Politecnica de Valencia, where I prepared my diploma project.

After the diploma exam, I started my life as an engineer at SC Libertatea SA Cluj-Napoca, a traditional company with a lot of experience in wood industry. After the first months as an intern, I was head of department for almost three years, with several hundred subordinates. All this time, I kept in touch with the Faculty of Wood Industrialization, and in 2004 I graduated from the advanced study

programme Modelling and Optimization in Wood Industry.

In 2004 I enrolled as a doctoral student at Prof. Dr. Eng. Ivan Cismaru, on a part-time basis, in parallel with the challenges in the world of real industry.

Meanwhile I participated in the annual design competitions, organized by the Association of Furniture Manufacturers in Romania, resulting in various awards and mentions and a lot of satisfaction to see that the products thought by me are seen and appreciated by the specialists in this industry.

In 2006 I became production manager at SC Becker-Romania SRL - Gherla, where the technical challenges of the elements moulded from veneer made me love this industry even more.

From 2008 to 2014, I was executive director at the same company, still keeping in touch with the Faculty of Wood Engineering and promoting the beauty of this field of activity in front of students at Wood Engineering and other faculties, such as Design in Cluj- Napoca, or Architecture in Bucharest.

In 2011 I defended my doctoral thesis entitled "Study on the optimization of composite lamellar structures, made of wood, used in constructions", obtaining the title of Doctor of Industrial Engineering.

From 2014 to 2016 I worked as general manager at SC Sortilemn SA - Gherla. Since 2016, considering that I have learned enough and gained enough experience, I decided to embark on the path of entrepreneurship as a partner in the company Becker Solid Wood and Service SRL (production of semi-finished products and small solid wood furniture).

## IN MEMORIAM - PROF. DR. ENG. VASILE ŞOVA



1930-1998

He was born on 1 January 1930 in the city of Moineşti, Bacău County. He attended primary school between 1936-1941 in his hometown, and high school in Câmpina, graduating in 1949.

He attended the courses of the Faculty of Wood Industry within the Polytechnic Institute of Brasov from 1949 to 1954, which he graduated as a valedictorian.

In 1954, he was assigned to the Department of Machinery and then to the Department of Thermotechnics and Fluid Mechanics at the Polytechnic Institute of Brasov, which later became Transilvania University of Brasov.

He taught two basic courses: Thermotechnics and Economy of Energetics.

He was an outstanding personality of Romanian Thermotechnics, a teacher valued by students for his capability, professionalism and morality and a scientific researcher with original results in the field of wood drying and heat and mass transfer.

Thus, he designed, built and used an original drying stand that allowed, for the first time, the simultaneous determination of temperature, speed and humidity in the boundary layer.

He published over 80 scientific papers, of which two in foreign journals and three in journals of the Romanian Academy and also five didactic books.
