Between 22 and 23 February, Transilvania University of Brașov hosted the first meeting of *EDU4PlastiCircular* project, bringing together European partners to promote sustainable education in terms of plastic materials.

The project coordinator, Prof. Dr. Eng. Anca Drăghici, Professor at "Politehnica" University of Timișoara, chaired the meeting during which *INNO3D* Printing Centre for Students was visited as well, thus giving us inspiration for the project.



The project partners are Transilvania University of Brașov, "Politehnica" University of Timișoara, Dermol svetovanje d.o.o. of Slovenia, Universitat Politècnica de València, Spain, Faculty of Environmental Protection of Velenje, Slovenia and Universita degli Studi dell'Insubria, Italy.

The main goal of the project is to develop and stimulate the green skills of both academic teaching personnel and students, of both managers and employees, as well as the green practices and awareness of plastics in the circular and neutral economy, contributing to EU's digital transformation by:

- Creation of innovative training methods and of a reference framework for the process, based on the best education practices;
- Launch of open training materials, of an elearning platform with refresher courses for at least 200 trainees.

The training programme will include the following modules:

- Introduction to the world of plastics;
- Management of plastic waste;
- Plastics in the circular economy and neutral climate;
- Innovation in the world of plastics;
- Awareness of the impact of plastic waste and responsible behaviour.



Following the meeting, we felt excited about the challenges ahead, aware of the impact we can have in education and the use of plastics. Circler Project — Circular Economy Transition Manager: Guiding Companies of the Furniture Value Chain to Deploy Their Transition Strategy for a more circular economy



CirCLER is a new European project launched on the 1st of February 2024, and co-funded under the Erasmus+ call ERASMUS-EDU-2023-PI-ALL-INNO, in which the Faculty of Furniture Design and Wood Engineering within Transilvania University of Braşov has the role of partner. The project will run for three years.

The main goal of the CirCLER project is to define the professional figure of the Circular Economy Transition Manager for the wood and furniture industry and his/her related necessary training, that is, the set of skills expected by companies for this emerging role.

The project also aims to facilitate and guide the transition of the furniture industry towards a circular and sustainable economy.

The strategic objectives of the project include the development of new skills, the promotion of corporate social responsibility, the encouragement of entrepreneurial initiatives and the increase in the quality of skills.

CirCLER aims to create innovative training toolkits, which will include multimedia and interactive materials and tools, thus enabling the providers of Vocational and Technical Education (VET) and Higher Education (HE) in the EU to train professionals to successfully lead the transition to a circular economy along the entire value chain in the furniture sector.

The project consortium consists of 16 partners from 9 European countries, respectively from 19 international bodies that will provide support for it.

Between 13 and 14 February 2024, representatives of Transilvania University of Braşov participated in the kick-off meeting of the Erasmus+key action 2 project, entitled Improving Mechanical Engineering Education in Moldova for Industry 4.0 - NEEDEDU4.0, held at the Technical University of Moldova.

For three years from now, from 2024 to 2026, Transilvania University of Braşov, together with RWTH Aachen and Dräxlmaier Group — as an industrial partner, will provide assistance to the Technical University of Moldova, Alecu-Russo University of Bălți and Bogdan Petriceicu Haşdeu University of Cahul, with a view to developing and implementing a new master's degree programme in the field of mechanical engineering, in partnership with the industrial environment. This new study programme aims at strengthening the educational capacity of the academic personnel as well as at

developing modern laboratories in accordance with the European standards, so that future graduates have relevant skills for the 4.0 industry.

The participation of Transilvania University of Brașov in this project, through the team made up of Prof. Dr. Eng. Simona Lache, Assoc. Prof. Dr. Eng. Marian-Nicolae Velea, Dr. Eng. Eugen-Valentin Butilă and Ec. Patricia Stanciu, is a good opportunity to share with the Moldovan partners the experience and expertise accumulated over the years in the design and implementation of study programmes in collaboration with the economic environment.

UNITBV'S PARTICIPATION IN THE KICK-OFF MEETING OF *RE-GRAD* PROJECT, AT THE TECHNICAL UNIVERSITY OF MOLDOVA

The launching event of the Erasmus+ KA2 project "Reforming Undergraduate Education for Green and Sustainable Development in Armenia and Moldova" (RE-GRAD) took place at the Technical University of Moldova, in Chişinău, from 15 to 16 February 2024.

For three years (1 January 2024 – 31 December 2026), the consortium consisting of 12 partner institutions from five countries will be supporting the reform of undergraduate higher education in Moldova and Armenia, focused on the transition from traditional education to an inclusive, digital and ecological education, for the benefit of sustainable development.

Transilvania University of Braşov, together with the University of Sannio, CESIE Palermo and the University of Strasbourg, will provide assistance to modernize the bachelor's degree programmes in Moldova and Armenia, to improve the teaching personnel's skills and to promote the principles of sustainable development in higher education all over the two countries. The team from Transilvania University of Braşov will share with the partners the experience and expertise acquired in the development and application of policies and practices related to the design of academic programmes.

The collaboration and exchange of best practices between the higher education institutions involved in the project will contribute to training future generations of professionals aware of their impact on the environment, an important step in building a more sustainable and responsible future both in the Republic of Moldova and in Armenia.

ROUND TABLE. THE VISIT OF PROF. DR. ENG. ADRIAN BASARAB



On 26 February 2024, a round table was held at the Dean's Office of the Faculty of Electrical Engineering and Computer Science, which had as its protagonist Prof. Dr. Eng. Adrian Basarab, member of CREATIS Research Centre (Centre for Research in Image Acquisition and Processing for Health) within the University of Lyon, France. With a remarkable research activity (30 Google h-index), Prof. Dr. Eng. Adrian Basarab has been the editor of Elsevier's Signal Processing magazine since January this year.

Prof. Adrian Basarab visited the faculty and University in the week from 26 February to 1 March 2024, as a guest of our University, through "Transilvania University Guest" programme. On the first day of the visit, the round table at the Dean's Office of the Faculty of Electrical Engineering and Computer Science had as its main topics the Romanian research and the French-inspired models, but also the possibilities of collaboration between our University and the University of Lyon. On the same day, Prof. Dr. Eng. Adrian Basarab had a series of meetings with representatives of the university management, namely with the Rector, Prof. Dr. Eng. Ioan Vasile Abrudan, the Vice-Rector for Scientific Research, Prof. Dr. Carmen Buzea, as well as with the Director of the Doctoral School, Prof. Dr. Mona Arhire.

In continuation of his visit, on 28 February, Prof. Dr. Eng. Adrian Basarab gave a lecture entitled "Inverse problems in computational imaging: applications in medical ultrasound imaging" for the doctoral students and young researchers in the field of Electronic Engineering, Telecommunications and Information Technologies, as well as for the students in the master's degree programme of Electronic and Communication Integrated Systems, which was hosted by the Research and Development Institute of our University.

On 29 February, Prof. Dr. Eng. Adrian Basarab, also within the R&D Institute, had a working meeting with the members of the implementation team for the European Al4AGRI project entitled *Romanian Excellence Center on Artificial Intelligence on Earth Observation Data for Agriculture,* coordinated by Prof. Dr. Eng. Mihai Ivanovici.



During the meeting, Prof. Dr. Eng. Adrian Basarab gave a lecture entitled "When image restoration meets quantum mechanics". The achievements of the Al4AGRI project were presented to him, and a few ideas on the opportunities of applying the mathematical framework of inverse problems to solving some project-specific problems were discussed. Last but not least, the importance of involving the doctoral students and young researchers at the Faculty of Electrical Engineering and Computer Science in professional associations, such as IEEE, as well as real opportunities for future collaboration, including the achievement of doctoral theses en co-tutelle were considered.

Everyone willing to receive answers to various questions regarding the parents' challenges and the dynamics of interactions in the family was expected during 27 and 29 February at Cărturești Bookstore in the Council Square.

Is the development of the ability to think critically a significant challenge for parents today? What about the development of the skills needed to navigate a world flooded with information? How can we teach children to spot and criticize false information? How can young people acquire the skills to check sources, spot manipulation and ask the right questions? Can we help children become savvy media consumers, able to discern the difference between verifiable information and fabricated content? How do we deal with the children's self-destructive behaviours in a world full of challenges and pressures? How can parents prepare themselves to provide emotional support and teach children healthy ways to manage stress? How do we

set clear boundaries that encourage the children's autonomy and resilience? I'm a bad parent, where have I gone wrong? Is my child a naughty one? Or is the child's behaviour the expression of his/her needs?



In order to find the answer to the questions worded above, readers of all ages, parents, students, practicing psychologists, pre-university teachers attended the lectures and debate of several current topics, held by academic teaching personnel and experts in parenting and/or family psychology:

- ✓ Fact or fiction? Helping children distinguish truth from fake news Daniela Popa;
- ✓ How to defeat scene stealers. Effective strategies for parents in combating children's destructive behaviours – Ana Maria Cazan and Roxana Elena Stoica;
 - ✓ Is my kid a naughty one? Nicoleta Lupu.

As always, in a relaxed atmosphere, the audience present in the hall showed interest in the proposed set of themes by asking questions to the specialists and engaging in discussions on the day's topic.

We are talking about the route that takes Ana-Maria from Romania to Denmark and back.

A young, brave solo traveller who wanted to volunteer in Denmark at a school. There she worked for a year, after which she returned, still *by bike*, home. Everything she experienced on the road, the people she met, the routes, the rain, the sun, the cold, the thirst, the bicycle that sometimes rebelled on less travelled roads, the food, often extremely frugal and swallowed on the run, the wonderful origami offered to her occasional hosts... everything is written and painted in watercolour in her diary. *Curs* Publishing House of Cluj reproduced the diary and turned it into an attractive book, in excellent graphic conditions.

The participants in the book launch defined the message of the book themselves: it is an important lesson for all young people, students or graduates, an urge to courage, motion, physical endurance and communication, to reading books that can be talked about, and above all, the courage of venturing alone on the road of thousands of kilometres, the ability to skimp your minimal luggage, unwavering optimism. We are talking here about European roads, of course. But Ana-Maria also has a year of studies in Japan!



After the launch, the discussions moved to the painting and ceramics exhibition of the same bright personality that is Ana-Maria Răducanu, a woman of many talents and deep sensitivities. Ceramics are just cut out for her: small, delicate, easy to grasp with your hands and surprising at touch, alive and full of asymmetries. Colours and texture are like water and stone, fragments of nature.



The audience of all ages was delighted by the spontaneous interactions, as well as by the novelty and diversity of what was learned.

EXHIBITION BY ION DUMITRIU | THE DIAPHANOUS THING

Between 29 February and 29 April 2024, the Multicultural Centre presents the painting and photography exhibition of the artist Ion Dumitriu, curated by Mihnea Mircan, and entitled *The Diaphanous Thing*.

The exhibition is organized in Braşov with the support of *Ion Dumitriu* Foundation.



"This project brings together paintings and photographs, significant milestones for the artist lon Dumitriu's practice in the 70s-90s. The series is the factor that orders this project: the accumulation over time of some images dedicated to the same motives is the narrative thread of a singular reflection about copying and re-imagining reality, about correspondences between "what" and "how" we see, between the knowledge of some objects, which lon Dumitriu works on with an almost biographical interest, and their capacity of appearing over again with the intensity of an interjection.



The exhibition features segments from several representative cycles, paintings in which lon Dumitriu returns to landscape motifs, agricultural tools, fruits of the earth, as well as to the elements of rural architecture for which he is generally

known. Almost all these cycles of artworks have their origin in the activity conducted at Poiana Mărului, where Ion Dumitriu would paint every summer between 1971 and 1991, alongside Horia Bernea, Teodor Moraru, Teodor Rusu, Şerban Epure, and other artists." – Mihnea Mircan.



The exhibition also features three photographic series: *Love Story, The Landfill* and *The Child's Park,* each of them building a story on two trinkets found at the garbage dump in Giulești neighbourhood, near the ruins of Chiajna Monastery, respectively at the original playground built by Ilie Blejan.

Ion Dumitriu (Galați, 1943 – Bucharest, 1998) conducted his activity as a drawing teacher at several primary schools in Bucharest and its surroundings; and from 1980 until the end of his life, he was a teacher of drawing and painting at Nicolae Tonitza High School of Bucharest. He was a member of the Visual Artists' Union since 1975, and between 1991 and 1993 he was its vice-president. He regularly exhibited in galleries and museums all over Romania, and in the 90s his artworks were part of exhibitions held in France, Spain, Portugal and Great Britain.

Both the students and the professors of violin who had attended the masterclasses given Alina Nauncef made up the audience of the concert "Jueves musical" held on 29 February 2024, during which sonatas by W.A.

CHAMBER JAZZ AT TRANSILVANIA UNIVERSITY

On 9 February, the Multicultural Centre hosted the third concert of Chamber Jazz @ Transilvania University 2023-2024 season, performed by the trio *Time in Our Hands*. Chris Dahlgren (viola da gamba, double bass), Mircea Tiberian (piano) and Claudio Puntin (clarinets) are musicians and composers with unique voices and a vast experience that allows them to move with ease and spontaneity through musical genres and traditions, from baroque music to jazz and improvisation.



Chris Dahlgren is a musician, composer and professor. He was born in the United States, where he completed his musical studies and has performed with great jazz names such as Charles Tolliver, Herb Ellis, Johnny Coles & Joe Lavano. He is currently settled in Berlin where he performs, composes and collaborates with many European artists. In 2017 he recorded the album *Dhalgren*, followed in 2020 by *Songs from a Dystopian Utopia*, and in 2023 by *Got Milk*, released on Boomslang Records. Since 2004 he has been teaching at Hanns Eisler HfM and the Jazz Institute of Berlin.

Claudio Puntin is a composer, producer, clarinettist and professor. He recorded more than 100 albums and has worked with artists such as Hermeto Pascoal, Sidsel Endresen, Max Loderbauer, Ricardo Villalobos, Jan Bang, Skuli Sverrisson, Carla Bley. He composes symphonic, electronic music, but also

music for film or theatre. He collaborates with the Radio Orchestra of Bavaria, Lucerne Jazz Orchestra, WDR Radio Orchestra of Cologne, Musikfabrik of Köln, Modern Ensemble, WDR Big Band, NDR Big Band, and more. He currently teaches at the University of the Arts of Berlin, and regularly holds master classes and workshops all over the world.



Mircea Tiberian is an emblematic figure of the Romanian jazz, with a musical activity that materialized in thousands of concerts and more than twenty albums made under his own name; the latest of which appeared in 2019 on the Fiver House record label under the title *Looking Forward to the Past*. He is the initiator and leader of the first and most consequential form of higher education in jazz of our country. Interested as well in literature, musicology and the interference of artistic fields, he has published numerous articles, books and anthologies such as *Magister Musicae in the Land of Smiles, Jazz Inside out* (Tracus Arte, 2012) or *The Sound of Reference* (Nemira, 2013).

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
