#### THE 3RD EDITION OF CRSTS 2018

#### THE CHINA-ROMANIA SCIENCE AND TECHNOLOGY SEMINAR

Between 24-27 April, 150+ faculty staff, doctoral students, and researchers participated in CRSTS 2018, the Science and Technology Seminar organized at Transilvania University of Braşov. The 3rd CRSTS was organized in partnership with Shenyang Jianzhu University, China, under the patronage of the Ministry of Science and Technology of the People's Republic of China and the Ministry of Research and Innovation of Romania.



The panel sessions highlighted the state-of-theart research and top achievements in the field of construction industrialization and green building. Similarly, Romanian and Chinese specialists presented research papers in the field of civil engineering, mechanical engineering, and manufacturing engineering.



Attending the event were Dr Huang Wei, Vice Minister of Science and Technology in the People's Republic of China, Dr Nicolae Burnete, Minister of Research and Innovation in Romania, Dr Ioan Vasile Abrudan, Rector of Transilvania University of Braşov, and Dr Li Peigen, President of the Chinese Mechanical Engineering Society.

The opening ceremony of CRSTS 2018 was held at Aula Magna, where the keynote speeches took place, while the parallel sessions took place at the Research and Development Institute of Transilvania University of Braşov.

#### LANGUAGE SUSTAINABILITY IN A CHANGING WORLD

#### THE 16th EDITION OF THE CONFERENCE ON BRITISH AND AMERICAN STUDIES

On 20 and 21 April, the Department of Theoretical and Applied Linguistics from the Faculty of Letters organized the 16<sup>th</sup> edition of the Conference on British and American Studies. The keynote idea of this year's edition - entitled *Language Sustainability in a Changing World* - fell within the ambit of sustainable theoretical and applied linguistic research in the Academia.



The event took place at *Aula Magna* and was attended by participants from Great Britain, Finland, Japan, Slovenia, Georgia, and Romania. Their presentations were delivered to a keen audience consisting of faculty staff and students from the Faculty of Letters.

The first conference day was dedicated to panel sessions whose variety reflected the extensive area of academic research in the field: Pragmatics and Discourse Analysis, Translation and Interpretation Studies, Language Studies and Language Acquisition. A key moment was the plenary presentation given by Professor Anna Mauranen, a prominent specialist and Research Director at

University of Helsinki, Finland. Prof. Mauranen offered a highly original perspective on metadiscourse in academic speaking, on the roles that metadiscourse, also called discourse reflexivity, assumes for speakers in reconstructing speech, meaning, and knowledge.

On the second day, the participants were invited to attend a round table entitled *Developing Professional Networks*, which was mainly focused on introducing finalized or ongoing research projects, exchanging expertise regarding the systems of doctoral mentorate in Romania, Finland and Great Britain, as well as on highlighting the importance of interdisciplinarity in academic research.

## THE MEMORY OF THE PAST – BRIDGES THROUGH TIME RESTORATION EXHIBITION AT THE FACULTY OF WOOD ENGINEERING

On 20 April, the Faculty of Wood Engineering hosted the 13th annual restoration exhibition called "Memory of the past – bridges through time". Over 25 wooden exhibits belonging to the mobile cultural heritage were brought together: furniture, ornaments, and musical instruments, as well as more traditional objects. Over the years, these restoration exhibitions stood out by an ascending dynamics. The restoration projects were admired both for their diversity, and for the novel approach in their display.



Organizers of the event were senior undergraduate students in Engineering and Design of Wood Finished Products who showcased their projects developed as part as the Furniture Restoration course. The case studies were diverse, and the challenges great. Our students alternatively acted as carpenters, artisans, artists, and even clay-workers. Almost all restoration techniques were used: veneer furniture, wood sculpting, various finishing techniques, violin restoration techniques etc.



The title of this year's exhibition symbolizes the role of memory of the past which is inherent in the complex process of identification, recovery, and preservation — restoration of cultural heritage objects. The centrepiece of the exhibition, a violin dating back to the end of the 19th century, connected past and present, creating an imaginary bridge, with the new tunes it can from now on carry.



The public were therefore given the opportunity to travel back in time through their contact with heritage objects preserved and restored by students. We are certain that the preservation-restoration activity done at our faculty is useful in developing professional competences, a moral profile for those involved, and a civic attitude, beneficial in the long run for the preservation of the cultural heritage in Romania.

The restoration exhibition also represented the backdrop for the award ceremony for the Student Conference, held on the same day. The exhibition will remain open to the public until 5 July.

#### AFCO 2018 - GRADUATES MEET COMPANIES

#### BETWEEN TRADITION, PROFESSIONALISM, AND PERFORMANCE

On 24 April, Aula Magna was the venue for the 7th edition of *AFCO - Graduates Meet Companies*—event, which brought together 200+ students, representatives of 40 companies, and teaching staff. The aim of the event was to create a space for dialogue between students and representatives of the local industries, developed around students' projects which were presented in poster format.



The main goal was developing collaboration between students and companies, specifically joint projects, with a view to employing students in the field of their original training. Although most of the topics related to students' graduation research, younger students also used the opportunity to showcase their projects.

Like with the previous editions, AFCO had the support of participant partners from the business environment. A record number of 30 participants took part in the event. The main partner was – for the second time running – SIEMENS CT.

The 10 panels of AFCO 2018 covered all the fields of study in the university. The representatives of the companies created a dedicated space for interviews and set up presentation and dialogue booths for students.



The authors of the highest ranking projects were awarded prizes at a gala organized on the evening of the same day; 23 prizes consisting of smart watches and two AFCO grand prizes (bikes) were awarded within the 10 panels. Additional prizes were awarded by Miele (professional vacuums) and Siemens CT (two subsidized internships). The evening concluded with a musical performance by Holograf.



AFCO has continously improved in both its organizational framework and conceptual content of the projects it helps publicize. The interest for the event keeps growing every year, both from students, as well as from the companies. Congratulations are in order to all the participants.

#### **GUITAR RECITAL - COSTIN SOARE**

#### DE LA PAGANINI LA PIAZZOLLA

Organized by Transilvania University's Musical Centre, Costin Soare's recital on 25 April was a remarkably diverse artistic event. Guitarist Costin Soare is one of the most awarded and active Romanian performers. He deftly combines the artistic, teaching and managerial careers; he is a guitarist, lutist, professor at *Dinu Lipatti* National College of Arts (Bucharest), associate professor at the National University of Music in Bucharest, and artistic manager of the International Festival *Guitar Evenings*.



A complex, passionate and profound musician, a skilful master of the history of music, Costin Soare enchanted his audience with a selection of classical masterpieces, a performance exceeding national and world standards. His main target

being the audience's understanding and deep involvement, Costin Soare made an impression with his sensitive and expressive performance: Romanza and Andantino Variato from Grande Sonata per chitarra sola by Niccolo Paganini; Recuerdos de la Alhambra by Francisco Tárrega and Asturias by Isaac Albeniz.

Prelude no.5 and Etude no. 11 by Heitor Villa-Lobos preceded Danza del Molinero by Manuel de Falla and Introduction and Variations on a Theme from The Magic Flute by Mozart, op. 9 by Francisco Sor.

The recital concluded with *Gran Jota* by Francisco Tárrega and *Primavera porteña* (*Spring in Buenos Aires*) by Astor Piazzolla, creator of the expressive Tango Nuevo. Undoubtedly, Costin Soare is a relentless promoter of the classical music. The unique sound of his instrument and his rich repertoire are much applauded by all music buffs.

#### THE IVth EDITION OF BRASSOVIA STUDENTS' CHAMBER MUSIC FESTIVAL

On 28 and 29 April, *Aula Magna* hosted the IV<sup>th</sup> edition of *Brassovia* Chamber Music Festival, a significant event that brought together students from the universities of Bucharest, Cluj, Iași and Brașov.

The event was opened by the representatives of *Gheorghe Dima* Academy of Music in Cluj-Napoca: the CHORDIS Quartet (Alex Lucian Cioată — first violin, Péter Domahidi — second violin, Flavius Ignat — viola and Kata Domahidi— cello) performing the *String Quartet No. 21 in D Major, KV 575.* The four young performers charmed the audience with their sensitive interpretation and expressive technique.



The next musical piece was Poulenc's Trio for oboe, bassoon, and piano, a piece dedicated to Manuel de Falla, and performed by TRIO Doris lorga — oboe, Robert Ivanov — bassoon and Monica Gemene — piano, from National University of Music Bucharest.

Coming from the same prestigious institution, the piano four-hands (Ana Bădică and Marius Boldea) gave the final act of the evening and performed a selection of *Hungarian Dances for piano four-hands* by Johannes Brahms. The two students completed each other and offered the keen audience a consistent, remarkable and accurate musical formula.



The second night of the event showcased the exquisite artistry of *Transilvania* University representatives: Mădălina Bourceanu — soprano and Botond Szöcs — piano, who presented well-known international lieds, such as *Noci* by Arthur Rubinstein, *Ich liebe dich* by Edvard Grieg, *Widmung* by Robert Schumann, *Ständchen*, *Gretchen am Spinnrade* and *Auf dem Wasser zu singen* by Franz Schubert.



Our students stood out through Mădălina Bourceanu's fluency and expressivity in her interpretation of the lied, as well as through Botond Szöcs's fine piano accompaniment and the remarkable proof he made of the subtleties of music.

They were followed by the students from *Gheorghe Dima* Academy of Music in Cluj-Napoca: LEV TRIO (Debora Ungureanu – violin, Kata Domahidi – cello and Melinda Móriczi – piano) who interpreted *Trio* 

élégiaque No. 1 in G minor by Serghei Rachmaninov, INTONO quartet (István Trombitás – first violin, Márta Trombitás – second violin, Edina Tifán - viola, Kristóf Jakabffy - cello) who performed Felix Mendelssohn – Bartholdy's String Quartet no.2 op.13 in A minor.

The second day of the festival ended with SOLARIS woodwind quintet from *George Enescu* University of Music, Iași (Andreea Mădălina Zota – flute, Oana Lavinia Cocîrță – oboe, Emilian Clipa – clarinet, Mihai Panaite – bassoon and Gheorghiță Cosmin Cobașa – horn) who interpreted Modest P. Mussorgsky's *Pictures at an Exhibition*, in a musical arrangement by Joachim Lincklmann. The vitality, ease and freshness of this performance enchanted the audience who were offered an encore, a unique interpretation of the famous *Hora Staccato* by Grigoraș Dinicu.



The high level of performance validated by well-deserved appreciation and applause from the audience is proof enough of the landmark status that *Brassovia* Music Festival organized by our university has acquired; at the same time, it is a generous gift from our young musicians to a fervent public.

#### HYMNS TO THE NIGHT

#### ALBRECHT MAURER & THEO JÖRGENSMANN

On 12 April, our Chamber Jazz concert series at Transilvania University featured violinist Albrecht Maurer and clarinetist Theo Jörgensmann.

With the expressive force of contemporary jazz, the "Hymns to the Night" performed by the two German musicians recreated the imagery and magic atmosphere of the literary work of the same title, while also evoking those formal peculiarities that made Novalis not only an exponent of early German Romanticism, but one of the precursors of modern poetry.



Structured by the tension between the parts and governed by the predilection for the fragment to the detriment of the whole, the musical discourse of these new "Hymns to the Night" unfolded through soothing harmonies, reaching a climactic dissonance.

The music of Maurer and Jörgensmann also resists being reduced to a formula, to some "-ism", by giving up what we conventionally call "style" or "manner" in favor of the spontaneous and authentic artistic expression.



The exuberant interpretation and the high degree of abstraction involved in such a performance made "Hymns to the Night" both a provocative and a surprisingly aesthetically coherent experience, as was the work of Novalis.




At the end of the evening, these affinities became the theme of an exciting discussion with the audience, moderated by Robert Elekes, poet and professor of German Literature.



#### **BOOKS THAT READ YOU**

#### **VERTICAL LIBRARIES** – LIVIU MOCAN'S SCULPTURE EXHIBITION

In April, the wide arcades and the intersecting midribs of the Multicultural Centre of Transilvania University had as their pillars a little more than their simple, monochromatic walls.



The exhibition *Vertical Libraries* by the famous Romanian sculptor Liviu Mocan brought to the attention of the public in Brașov an idea which, while previously explored, was given a new dimension: the act of reading seen as an ascending itinerary, a network of pilasters sustaining a large, clear-obscure cupola, against which culture itself is projected.

While it is precisely the books that lie at the heart of Liviu Mocan's numerous library-towers, their recognizable shapes dwindle out of sight. The sense-laden artefact transfigures, in its turn, the viewer.

The loss of materiality settles in gradually, from the disturbance of the form in right angles to its total exuviation. This lends the impression of finality to the tower in question — a false pinnacle. Liviu Mocan knows that humans, no longer speaking the same language, have definitely not given up the ideal of the Tower of Babel, but have only changed the essence of this ideal. The evangelists also knew this. The artist depicts them as the four pillars of the world. On the other hand, his *Two Mirrors* make an entire roving world turn to itself, a musing world that does not know when and where it is left without reflexion.



Still, we are warned – ironically, bitterly, or maybe just naturally: So that the letter should not be believed more strongly than is proper and the spirit should receive its due (Ludwig Wittgenstein).

Following this event, the students who participated in the event will receive 20 internships with the Environmental Guard.

#### SUCCESSFUL ALUMNI

#### MARIUS DRAGOMIR - A FACULTY OF LETTERS GRADUATE



Marius Dragomir is the director of the Center for Media, Data and Society of the Central European University (CEU). Previously, he worked for a decade at the Open Society Foundations (OSF) in London, where he coordinated the strategic and research plan within the Program for Independent Journalism (Program on Independent Journalism, formerly known as the Network Media Program). He was also one of the main coordinators of the most important research project within the Program for Independent Journalism 'Mapping Digital Media', involving 56 countries. At the same time, within the Open Society Foundations, he coordinated and edited 'Television Across Europe' a comparative study of TV stations' program policies across 20 European countries.

His career in journalism began over 25 years ago in Romania, where he worked for several newspapers, radio and TV stations. Since 1999, he has been working in the English-speaking mass-media. In 2015 he co-founded, with a group of journalists and researchers, mediapowermonitor.com, a community of media experts who analyze current business trends and political decisions that influence journalistic activity. He has authored several studies and articles on journalism and media policies that have been published and translated in over 60 countries.

'Attending the Faculty of Letters at Braşov had a huge impact on me, both professionally and personally. This is where the groundwork for my current professional career was laid, thanks to a team of outstanding professors. It is the place where I really learnt to read professionally, to think freely and critically, to be honest and open-minded.
